Celebrating the Dignity of the Human Body on Ascension Thursday

This **Thursday**, **May 14**, **is Ascension Thursday**, the day where we celebrate Christ's return to heaven through which he sanctified our bodies by bringing his own human body into heaven. The importance of this day makes it a **holy day of obligation** for our Archdiocese. We will have the usual **7am and 9am Masses at St. Thomas Aquinas Church**, and will be adding a special **7pm Mass over at St. Basil Chapel** for those who are not able to make the morning Masses because of work or school.

What we are celebrating on this day is that Jesus has made it possible for us to become like God, by becoming one of us. In taking his human body into heaven, Jesus has opened the gates of heaven for all of us. This means that it is possible for each of us to experience eternal joy as a complete person, not just a disembodied soul, but as a human person, body and soul. This is an amazing gift and an important reminder for us now since we are living in a world where many people seem to have forgotten the sacredness of the body. A lot of people treat the body like a shell for the soul and spirit, something to be changed and controlled and ultimately discarded while what is "really us" is the mind or spirit. That is very different than our Catholic conception of humanity. We are called to see ourselves as a complete whole. The body without the soul is dead, the soul without the body is incomplete. That is why we await the resurrection and why the Ascension is so important.

So as we come to this important solemnity on Thursday, please join us at one of the Masses and thank God for the gift of yourself. For the body that the Lord gave us so that we can experience the goodness of the material world, and for the great dignity that Jesus won for us by taking a human body, just like our own, and bringing it into the eternal happiness of heaven, where we hope to join him someday.
