#### Welcome

This weekend Fr. Adrian is away. I would like to thank Fr. Rick Gribble, CSC, a professor at Stonehill College for celebrating the 10 a.m. Mass at St. Basil's Chapel and the noon Mass at St. Thomas Aquinas.

Fr. Bill

When I was in Cologne, Germany for World Youth day back in 2005, toward the end of our Pilgrimage our group spent a few days in Belgium. A few of us opted to take a day trip to the Belgian city of Brugge, about a 2-hour drive from Brussels where we were staying. Brugge is a great, pretty much intact Medieval City. In the city square is the Basilica of the Holy Blood. It is called this because the Basilica houses a vial of, what for centuries many have believed to be Christ's Blood, the very Blood that was shed on the Cross on Calvary on Good Friday. I don't know if it was by chance or by an act of the Holy Spirit, but the vial of Blood, which was not scheduled to be on display for veneration on that day, was.

As we took the 2-hour drive back, we began talking about our experience. All of us remarked how truly awesome it was to have been able to reverence and venerate what we were told was Christ's actual blood. One of my friends, who had been sitting silently, spoke up. In a quizzical and challenging, yet uncondemning way, he said, "I'm a bit confused. As great an experience as today was, if we truly believe what we say we believe as Catholics regarding the Real Presence of Jesus' Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist, this awe, this amazement, this emotion we're all feeling, is this not how we should approach Eucharist every time we receive Communion? Because if we truly believe what we say we believe, then there is no difference between the Blood we just venerated and the Blood we receive at Mass."

#### Mind blown.

But my friend was and is absolutely correct. Whether or not the vial of Blood is authentic is not as important as our reactions to it were. We do not know if the Blood is real. We approached it as if it was the Real Blood of Christ, but there is no way to verify that is it or isn't. However, every time we attend Mass, we are explicitly given what we know and believe IS in fact the Real Blood of Christ. We know it is Real because Jesus Himself told us, "This *is* My Body, this *is* My Blood," and since its institution at the Last Supper, people have believed in the Real Presence in the Eucharist.

If, as Catholics, we truly believe what we say we do, that Communion *IS* the Real Body and Real Blood of Christ, then we should approach the Eucharist with the same awe, same love, and same emotion every time we receive Communion as the twenty of us did that July day in 2005. But how often do we? How often when we receive, myself included, do we truly think about the Real Presence, or do we just, go through the motions—"Amen" and then back to our seats? I've been there; Mass in the Seminary at 7:30am and for whatever reason, the cup of coffee at 6:30 hasn't kicked in yet. Before I know it, half asleep, I hear myself saying "Amen" without really having thought about what my, "I Believe" really means.

Today, Sunday, June 7, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of *Corpus Christi*—The Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus. We celebrate the Real Presence of Christ in the amazing and undeserved Gift of the Eucharist. As we celebrate this Solemnity, I put before you the challenge to really examine how is that you approach the Eucharist. What do the words, "The Body of Christ" mean to you? There's a short prayer many priests pray before they celebrate Mass that is, *Lord, may I celebrate this Mass like it was my first Mass, my last Mass, and my only Mass.* Please allow me the liberty to change this dictum slightly and challenge you to make this prayer, *Lord, may I receive this Communion like it was my first Eucharist, my last Eucharist, and my only Eucharist*—the Real Presence of that same Body which was scourged and that Blood which was shed.

His homily was captivating and entertaining. He told jokes, stories, and used references to movies to help the confirmandi understand what it means to be like Christ in the world. It is not easy to be a Christian in today's world. It's not supposed to be easy. He talked about Pope Francis who told the youth at World Youth Day, Rio di Janeiro, that they are called to go out into the world, to not be afraid, and to love one another as Christ loves. Please keep Bishop Dooher in your prayers as he recovers.
