Second Sunday of Easter

The forgiving attitude of the risen Christ showed to his close followers in today's gospel is quite striking. The apostles were hiding in a room for they were scared to death. They hid themselves from the Jews because they feared having to suffer the same fate with Jesus. From nowhere the risen Lord appeared in their minds and said, "Peace be with you!" The apostles deserved nothing but tongue-lashing for having deserted the Lord during his most painful walk to the cross. And yet, the risen Christ greeted them with peace and well-being. Like the father of the prodigal son, the Lord manifested no second thoughts in reaching out and forgiving offenders. The apostles, who themselves benefited the unconditional mercy of God, were given the authority to forgive sins. Primarily, they were to use this power not to condemn people but to extend God's mercy to repentant sinners. Bishops, the direct successors of the apostles, together with their priests, are now responsible for the keys of heaven. In the sacrament of reconciliation, they are to bring the heart of God which possesses all the love for humanity.

As we ourselves receive the mercy and forgiveness of God, we are also called to forgive and be reconciled to one another. We are challenged to keep a heart which is like the sacred heart of Jesus. Hatred and revenge have no place in the Christian community. If we truly believe in Christ, we should change the way we live and relate with one another.
