The image of the good shepherd is appropriated to Jesus because he possesses within himself the qualities of one who takes care of the flock. Like a good shepherd he knows us individually and looks after each one of us. As a good shepherd, Jesus leads us by example; he practices what he preached. And finally, like a good shepherd, Jesus is willing to give his life for our protection and well-being.

Almost all of us have shepherding roles. Priests and religious are called to lead the people in their journey to God or to heaven. Government and civil authorities are expected to lead their constituents to progress and prosperity. In the family, parents are the leaders of their children; while in the school, teachers are leaders of their students. However, we need to ask ourselves: What kind of leader or shepherds are we?

If we serve only when it is convenient, we are no good shepherds. If we serve only when there is money involved, we are what Jesus calls "robbers and thieves" of the flock. If we lead people only from a distance or if we have no personal involvement with those whom we serve, we are bad shepherd. What about us? Do we also have the courage to sacrifice our life for people entrusted to our care?
