5th Sunday of Easter - B

In today's gospel, Jesus uses the familiar image of the vine and the branches to teach us lessons about our Christian life. First of all, the image reminds us that God is the real owner of everything that we have and are. He is the vine grower. He does to us what he thinks good and right. As disciples, we need to live our life as if we don't own anything. We belong fully to God. We should not allow our selfishness and pride to make us think that we have absolute control over our lives. Rather, we always have to be open to God's action, confident that He knows fully what is good for us.

Secondly, the image teaches us that Jesus is the source of our life and the point that connects us with one another. He is the vine and we are the branches. A branch cut off from the vine will wither and die. And so it is with our life as disciples – we live fully and become fruitful only by remaining in Christ. In the gospel of John, the word "abide" appeared at least 37 times: "abiding in God," "abiding in Christ," and "abiding in his words." We need to remain in Christ because apart from him, we can do nothing.
