The St. Vincent de Paul Society is a worldwide organization founded by Frederick Ozanam in Paris, France, in 1833. Ozanam was a 20 year old man inspired by the principles of St. Vincent de Paul in the early 1600's. St. Vincent de Paul vowed his life to serving the poor with humble service.

We are a group of lay Catholic volunteers from all walks of life – neighbors helping neighbors right here in Ozaukee County. This help may include financial assistance with rent, utility bills, offering store vouchers for clothing and household goods, information on the various food pantries and/or other helpful services available to county residents.

On a person-to-person basis, through a Home Visit, members offer help, hope and encouragement to people in need – an ear to listen, a hand in a time of crisis and a hope to guide people toward programs that can bring lasting change into their lives. Vincentians offer "a hand up, not a handout," with the goal of helping others get on their feet and avoid needing assistance in the future.

There are five conferences in the Ozaukee County St. Vincent de Paul council, all of whom are supported by our store. They include: St. Joseph, St. Francis Borgia, Lumen Christi, Divine Savior, and St. John XXIII. Our St. John XXIII conference responds to a high proportion of the calls for Ozaukee County citizens in need. As need is so high in our communities, we ask that parish members prayerfully consider joining us in our mission.

We hold monthly meetings, at which we strive to increase member spirituality, encouragement and fellowship, as well as review requests for assistance and follow up on assistance already given. As we assist members of the community, we meet people from all backgrounds and learn about the variety of services and resources available to county residents. All members are trained before meeting with clients, and visits are always done in pairs so we are never alone on our mission. In addition to personal growth, members also receive a 25% discount at our thrift store!
