Ordinary Time: Today is the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Liturgical season of Ordinary time any time that is not is Advent/Christmas or Lent/Easter, holy day of obligation or a major feast. It has been said already, in this column,



that Ordinary Time is anything but ordinary. The gospels continue to proclaim the saving ministry of Jesus Christ, focusing on his miracles and healings and building the kingdom of God. Each Sunday is a "little Easter" as we give thanks for Christ's victory over sin and death and as we rejoice in his resurrection.

If we use the word "ordinary" in an ordinary way at all during this liturgical season, it refers to ordinary human existence that meets up with and is converted by the extraordinary life of the Divine. The bottom line is always the same: there is nothing really that ordinary about this time of the liturgical year and nothing really that ordinary about us either. Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen. Alleluia!
