On Pilgrimage once again: From June 22nd to June 30th this year, I am very blessed to be on another pilgrimage and this time it is to Guatemala! I am joining leaders from the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, the Mission Office, Schools Office and leaders from St. Clement School in St. Bernard.

Bill Tonnis from Our Lady of Visitation parish is also going with us. We will be meeting with Bishops and educators to investigate the possibilities of twinning relationships with parishes and schools in Guatemala and parishes and schools in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. Bill Tonnis and I are particularly interested in exploring possibilities of twinning relationships with parishes and schools that some of our St. Leo parishioners are from. We are definitely visiting some of the cities and parishes of our parishioners. Because of this, I will be able to bring home Baptismal Records for those who need them so they will not have the very long wait of the "snail" mail process. I can also take pictures of families from our people to their people since many of them have not seen each other for some time or cannot communicate often. I am very excited about visiting the country of our parishioners, enjoying its beauty and learning about the many life situations that the people must face.

It is a pilgrimage so I have had two orientation meetings already and it is only one week away, so I got updates on my vaccinations from my doctor and I am reading about life and the culture in Guatemala. I am also reading about the political situation and the violence and crime that plague the country sometimes. These are some of the reasons along with economic poverty why people are fleeing Guatemala for the United States. Some of the pilgrims who are going on this trip will be at our 6pm Liturgy on Saturday, June 20th. We will have a special blessing for them and sending forth. Please continue to pray with us and for us. Many Thanks.

Speaking of Prayers: I recently talked with a parishioner mother whose daughter is on journey from Guatemala to the United States and then hopefully to Cincinnati. Her daughter is 17 years old. The journey is very long and dangerous. The mother has asked for prayers for her daughter's safety. I promised her that I would be praying and I have placed a petition in our prayer wall for her as well. Would you be so kind as to remember her in

your personal prayers also? Please continue to remember all refugees and immigrants in your prayers. Again, thank you so much!
