Father Bob's Ramblings

The year 2017 marks the 100th Anniversary of the apparitions of the Blessed Virgin to the children of Fatima. The Church around the world will celebrate this centenary. Here in the Diocese of Providence Bishop Tobin has designated the entire year as a year dedicated to help us renew our devotion to Mary, the Mother of God. By dedicating the entire year to Mary, the Bishop feels that it is a privileged moment in which we should heed and hear once again the message of our Blessed Mother at Fatima.

Mary's messages at Fatima was a call to all Christians to conversion and repentance for sins, an invitation to deepen and intensify our prayer life, especially through the rosary, and an increased devotion to Mary's Immaculate Heart. Mary's apparitions in Fatima took place at the beginning of World War I. It was Mary's hope that following her messages the world would become a more peaceful place.

The Diocese will observe this Marian Year on a number of occasions that will be announced in the coming months. However, so that we, as a diocesan family will be united in our prayer during this Marian Year, the Bishop suggests that in each month we take to heart the public intentions he has created. These include the following:

- <u>January</u>: For an increase in Respect for Life, especially for unborn children
- **February**: For Religious Men and Women
- March: For repentance of our sins
- **April**: For many vocations to the Priesthood
- May: For peace, justice, freedom & prosperity in every nation
- <u>June</u>: For priests, deacons, religious and all who minister in the Church
- July: For religious freedom
- <u>August</u>: For those with special needs in our community
- <u>September</u>: For the protection of the environment
- October: For all who are ill
- **November**: For the Faithful Departed
- <u>December</u>: For our families, especially our troubled families

The Bishop further hopes that this Marian Year will renew our devotion to the Blessed Mother.
