In addition, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are **fast days**: those between the ages of 18 and 59 should eat less, meaning, take no solid food between meals and only one full meal that day. Serious reasons such as one's health can excuse a person from these rules.

#### Father Bob's Ramblings

This past Wednesday, we joined with Christians throughout the world and marked the beginning of Lent. As we presented ourselves for ashes, we heard the words, "Repent, and believe in the Gospel." As we gather on this First Sunday of Lent, the readings remind us that even though we humans continue to turn away from God, God continues to keep His Covenant of Love; the Promise that He will always be faithful to us, no matter what!

The theme of our weekend Lenten scripture readings this year is about the *gift* God's Covenant of love with us, His People. Each weekend we will hear one of the Covenant stories from the Old Testament, where God reiterates His Promise of faithfulness and love.

Today we hear the Covenant with Noah. Although the Noah story may seem to be merely a part of a children's story, its purpose in the Bible is very serious. The Covenant God made with Noah is one of the primary Covenants God makes with His people. It is the touchstone of God's ongoing, beneficent relationship with the created world and peoples of the earth.

Have you ever thought of Lent as a *gift*? I don't think that *gift* is the first word that comes to mind when I think about Lent which is characterized by a theme of repentance and practices of sacrifice and self-denial.

But, Lent is a *gift* from the Lord. It is a sign of his love. Lent's *gift* is time – a long time – forty days for us to focus on, to think over, and to make any changes that are needed in our lives.

Another Lenten *gift* is a time when God speaks to our heart. He invites us to set right not only the wrongs we have done, but the good we have failed to do. It's a time do the things we have neglected to make our lives complete.

During this Lenten Time, maybe we can take time in our prayer to reflect on the *gifts* of the Covenant of Love that God has made with each one of us. And, let us try to be more faithful in living it out.
