LENTEN FAST AND ABSTINENCE REGULATIONS

Church law requires abstinence from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent (for those 14 and older). In addition, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are **fast days**: those between the ages of 18 and 59 should eat less, meaning, take no solid food between meals and only one full meal that day. Serious reasons such as one's health can excuse a person from these rules.

Important News From the IRS

The new Tax Law of 2017 has an important change regarding charitable giving that begins in 2018. Any parishioners who are taking distributions from and IRA can make donations directly to charities. The advantage is that the charitable gift reduces your taxable distributions for the year.

For Example: If you are withdrawing \$1,000 a month from an IRA you may choose to make your church budget contribution from that withdrawal. If you give St. Brigid's \$1,000 in the course of the year from your IRA account, your 1099R for the IRA in 2018 would only show a taxable amount of \$11,000 rather than \$12,000.

Father Bob's Ramblings

This weekend we celebrate *Laetare Sunday*, the halfway point of Lent. The name goes back to when the mass was in Latin and the first words of the Entrance Antiphon were *Rejoice, Jerusalem! Be glad for her*... It parallels the Third Sunday in Advent, when we light the pink candle on the Advent Wreath. Today, we light pink candles at the altar.

The First Reading continues presenting to us how God constantly renews his faithfulness and Covenant of Love with his people, even if they fail to keep faith in him and sin.

Today's reading from the Book of Chronicles tells us of the great news that the People of Israel were being given back their freedom and allowed to go back home to Jerusalem. After the destruction of Jerusalem, the Israelites were expelled from their homeland and made slaves by the Babylonians who deported them to Babylon. There they awaited the day when they would be able to return home.

The Babylonians were defeated by the Persians (today's Iranians). It was the Persian King, a non-Jew, that God uses to free the Israelites. The author recounts and interprets the history that led to this moment. He sees in this history the justice of God, but also God's mercy in renewing once again his Covenant of making the Israelites his people and he their God if they kept their part of the covenant (contract).

The reading is a reminder to us, who are now God's Chosen People through Jesus Christ, that he is also faithful to us, even when we sin. It is the same love and mercy that God offers us as we return to God with all our heart during these days of our Lenten Journey.
