# **Important News From the IRS**

The new Tax Law of 2017 has an important change regarding charitable giving that begins in 2018. Any parishioners who are taking distributions from and IRA can make donations directly to charities. The advantage is that the charitable gift reduces your taxable distributions for the year.

For Example: If you are withdrawing \$1,000 a month from an IRA you may choose to make your church budget contribution from that withdrawal. If you give St. Brigid's \$1,000 in the course of the year from your IRA account, your 1099R for the IRA in 2018 would only show a taxable amount of \$11,000 rather than \$12,000.

# Father Bob's Ramblings

This week we celebrate the feast days of two favorite saints: St. Patrick and St. Joseph. Even though these days have become secularized celebrations with parades, parties, and nationalistic rivalries, both saints are important in the history of our faith.

St. Joseph, the spouse of the Virgin Mary and stepfather of Jesus, is a model of trust and humility for all of us. He trusted in God's words to him about taking Mary as his wife and about protecting the Child Jesus. Although he was always in the background, he humbly cared for his family through his carpentry profession.

Legends about St. Patrick abound; but truth is best served by our seeing two solid qualities in him also: he was humble and he was courageous. At the age of 16 he was captured and made a slave in Ireland, but he soon escaped to France, had a spiritual conversion, ordained a priest & bishop, and then returned to convert the people of Ireland.

Although Italians claim St. Joseph and the Irish claim St. Patrick, both are saints for all people to admire and pray to for help in better living our faith.

This week also brings us another step closer to our Holy Week and Easter celebration. The whole season of Lent hopes to lead us to an authentic conversion that holds Jesus' death and resurrection at its core. The call to conversion was present among the prophets, and today Jeremiah reminds us of it. And, although the apostles didn't understand at first, Jesus reminded them that this new life requires surrender, like the grain of wheat that is sown and produces good fruit. What do we take away from Jesus' own surrender, and how can we imitate it in our own lives? What do we give of ourselves fully to: family, work, church, relationships? What needs to die in us so we can truly become holy as God is holy?
