# Father Bob's Ramblings

On this Third Weekend of Lent, our liturgy begins to focus on the theme of Christian Initiation or Baptism. We turn to the Gospel of St. John who will lead us for the next three weeks. Today, we focus the first of the Johannine "initiation" passages, the encounter between Jesus and a Samaritan woman. The place of their meeting, Jacob's well, turns our attention to water and its role in initiation. Today we acknowledge Jesus as *living water*, "a spring, welling up to eternal life."

Much of the rest of the liturgy echoes the Gospel passage. The Preface adds another dimension to our understanding of the Gospel passage, "the fire of divine love" that Christ awakened in the Samaritan woman. After all, in the Bible wells are places of romance, and in Jesus, the woman finds at last her heart's desire, to receive forgiveness and begin a life centered on God.

Lent's theme of repentance for those already baptized is not, of course, absent from today's liturgy. The Opening Prayer speaks of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer as means of overcoming sin. The Prayer over the Gifts reminds us that "we who beseech pardon" must "take care to forgive our neighbor."

As we continue on our Lenten Journey, we are reminded that it is Baptism that incorporates us into the Body of Christ and makes us Children of God. May we continue to walk on this Journey by doing the things that help us to become more holy as God's Children.

In the next column of this page, there is an announcement of a new ministry the diocese is setting up to train people to visit lonely, elderly residents in nursing homes. It is called *"Mixed Blessings."* The first home to institute this ministry in the diocese is Cherry Hill Nursing Facility. I hope we can have some parishioners attend this first information night at St. Robert's. Please let me know if you are interested in learning more about this most important ministry.
