#### Father Bob's Ramblings

Our Gospel readings of the initiation passages from St. John's Gospel come to a climax this week with the last and greatest of Jesus' signs: the raising of Lazarus from the dead. The Messiah already revealed himself as "living water" (the story of the Woman at the Well) and "the Light of the World" (the story about the Man Born Blind), now he triumphs as the "God of life," God's victory over sin and death. The preface for today's mass puts it well: "As true man, he wept for Lazarus his friend, and as eternal God, he raised him from the tomb." This Gospel story also includes another of Jesus' "I AM" statements that declare his identity as God, using the name God gave when he spoke to Moses. We will be hearing a number of these "I AM" statements as we move into Holy Week.

The first reading from the Prophet Ezekiel connects Jesus to the prophetic promise: "I will open your graves and have you rise from them. I have promised, and I will do it, says the LORD." This promise of restoration prefigures the promise of Christ to "raise you up on the Last Day."

Though astounded by life and the events that life seems to bring us, we are never far from the cross during this Lenten season. The liturgy today asks us to be attentive to Jesus' saving death, so that we might be inspired to live following his footsteps, preparing us to move into the celebration of the mysteries of Holy Week and Easter.
