Father Bob's Ramblings

Today we begin the holiest week of our entire Christian year. It is a time to remember the essential aspects of our Christian faith, the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus. Most importantly, we celebrate these events during the *Triduum*, which means "three days." Throughout his ministry, Jesus predicted his passion by referring to the "third day." On Thursday, we enter that sacred time outside of time in which we spend three days with Christ, to serve, to suffer, to die and to rise.

For the early Christians, the celebration of the *Triduum* took place in the context of the Jewish Passover (which begins on Tuesday). Passover remembers the night when the angel of God destroyed the firstborn of the Egyptians, freeing the Hebrew people from their long slavery. The holiest days for the Jewish people became the holiest days for Christians, when we recall our history and ancestry from the Jewish people and celebrate its fulfillment in Jesus Christ.

In the liturgies of the *Triduum*, we remember the Passion, Death and Resurrection of the Lord. Even though these liturgies are full of drama and powerful sense of history, liturgical remembering is not about the past, it is about the present. The Resurrection is not just remembered, as other great events of history are remembered; the Resurrection *happens*. In the words of Pope Emeritus Benedict: "This is the joy of Easter. The Resurrection is not a thing of the past; the Resurrection has reached us and seized us. We grasp hold of it, we grasp hold of the risen Lord, and we know that he holds us firmly even when our hands grow weak."

All this is powerfully expressed in the rites and prayers of our liturgical celebrations on Thursday, Friday and Saturday. It is a time for all of us, families, staff, youth and homebound members of our parish, to go on retreat. We can do this by keeping the spirit of these days as much as possible at home. We can try to lead a much quieter life on those days, spending some time in quiet prayer, changing our schedules and cutting out a lot of noise, and attending the beautiful liturgical celebrations. I invite everyone to enter into the spirit of this week whether or not you can join us at the liturgies, but I hope many of you can join us.

We also will be welcoming Fr. Ngozi Onyelu, a priest from Nigeria, who will be with us for our Triduum celebrations. Fr. Ngozi was born in Achi, a town in Igbo heartland of Nigeria. He was ordained for the Diocese of Idah. He served in parish ministry for 9 years, then went on to graduates studies in Britain, then went on to minister in the Diocese of Edmonton, New Brunswick, Canada. To mark his 30 years of priesthood he is involved in a program of Clinical Pastoral Education, a program that I taught in for 25 years before coming to St. Bridgid's. His connection to me is that he is now studying under one of my former students in Canada. Let's welcome him with our typical, warm St. Brigid welcome.
