Father Bob's Ramblings

Now that we have celebrated the entire Paschal Mystery –which includes the death and resurrection of Jesus and the sending of the Holy Spirit –we begin the season of Ordinary Time to help us reflect on various aspects of our faith. This weekend we summarize the Easter Season with a feast of God's unity, redemption, and love. This is all included as we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity. The Holy Trinity is one of the mysteries of our faith. It is a mystery because no human terms or examples can fully explain what the Holy Trinity is. Because it is a mystery of faith, it is also an aspect that continually evolves as we try to live out our faith.

The Holy Trinity celebrates that God is one, and God is love. To share in God's life is to share in God's love. Saint Paul communicates this when he wrote to the Corinthians, "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God, our Father, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all."

We often hear this verse or similar verses of scripture quoted at the beginning of every Mass when the celebrant greets the people. He says words that date back to the first century because our faith communities today have the same spiritual needs as did the Corinthians of old.

Paul's greeting names all three members of the Trinity and assigns each of them a quality. Jesus comes to us with grace, the goodness that stirs up thanksgiving in our heart. God, the Father, comes to us in love, the virtue that sparked creation and that led to our redemption. The Holy Spirit brings fellowship, a sharing of God's joy in our communion with one another. Paul also urged the Corinthians to rejoice and to live in peace. A harmonious community experiences the presence of God, because the members of the Trinity dwell in perfect harmony.

As we know, church communities have never been perfect. We do not always love one another as we should. We sometimes cause division by our words or actions or by neglecting or ignoring others. But the Trinity gives us an example and all the encouragement we need. We aim to try to incorporate the divine harmony of life and love into our lives and communities. We also wish this harmony for ourselves every time we begin Mass with Paul's greeting.

As we celebrate this feast, may grace, love, and fellowship be ours.
