Our goal once again this year was **\$13,500.** Our final tally is **\$9,244.00** from **91** households, which is 68.47% of our goal. Thank you to all who contributed to our Appeal this year.

Father Bob's Ramblings

Every spring, a representative from Catholic Mutual, our Diocesan Insurance Agency, comes to examine our property and buildings. And, each year he always sends a list of needed repairs or areas where we need to monitor for possible repairs in the future. This year the report came back with some major issues that need to addressing immediately.

The outside covering of stucco on the church chimney is falling off because of moisture entering between the chimney itself and the stucco. The chimney needs to be resealed and the stucco replaced and repainted.

The decorative cement buttress on the right side of the front entrance of the church has crumbled and needs replacing. However, the cause of this deterioration is a leak coming from the roof over the foyer of the church. This leak is also causing moisture to come between the interior walls and the stucco, causing the stucco to discolor and crumble. The roof needs re-sealing and the stucco needs replacing and repainting. The same is happening to the front corner of the church on the Pocasset Street side.

The next major and immediate issue is the chimney on the rectory roof. If you look at it, you can see through it! The chimney needs total replacement.

The exterior stairs in the front and side of the church need repairing and the two entire stairways need repainting.

Finally, the carpeting in the church is old and needs either replacing or stretching in order to smooth out uneven areas and reduce trip and fall potential.

As you may imagine, this was not good news. Although I was planning to have the stairs and the cement buttress fixed this summer, I truly was surprised by the news about the two chimneys. Certainly, these take priority in our "to-do" list.

I have contacted masonry contractors for bids on the work, asking them for detailed figures so we can determine exactly what we can and cannot afford to do. I will be meeting with our Trustees, Ed Eramian and Carol Marrocco on Monday to begin our process of prioritizing the work, accepting bids, and discussing how we will pay for the repairs.

As always, I'll keep you informed.

Summer Safety Tips
