## Father Bob's Ramblings

Two events this month, I believe, certainly have caught our attention and the attention of most of the rest of the country and the world. The first event is the racial demonstration and murder in Charlottesville, Virginia on August 12th. The second is that of the flooding caused by Hurricane Harvey this past week. As Christian people, we are obligated to respond to each of these events.

Racism is one of the greatest sins we all share in as Americans. It began with the destruction of the Native American peoples and the slavery of Black People. And, it continues to this day, even though President Abraham Lincoln abolished slavery after the Civil War. We all carry the woundedness that comes from racism that lies buried in each of us. How often does it just come out in an off-handed remark or joke? How often has it raised its ugly head in fears we have about people who are different than we are? How often have we put people of color down or thought of them as being less than we are?

We all need to become more conscious of the racism that lies deep within us. The best way to begin healing that sin is to first recognize and admit that it is there. Then, we need to try to catch ourselves when it raises its ugly head in our jokes, our conversations, or fears. And then, we must speak out about it when we hear or witness it. Otherwise, if we say nothing, we become complacent to it.

The devastation caused by Hurricane Harvey must also make us stop and recognize how lucky we are to live where we do. I was talking with someone this week who pointed out that even our worst storms –snow, rain, flooding, or hurricanes – are nothing compared to what people in other parts of the country experience. Here too, our Christian responsibility is to respond. Initially, we can do that by prayer for those who have had their lives turned upside down and for the first responders. We can also reach out by sacrificially donating money, clothing, or even our time, if possible.

As with so many other events, we seem to forget about them once they are no longer the headlines. Nevertheless, racism and the effects of disasters continue long after the headlines move onto other things. May we work at trying to rid ourselves of racism and never forget those whose lives will never be the same.
