Father Bob's Ramblings

Every day we do many things to help make us feel secure. We fasten the seat belts in our cars. We set alarms to prevent theft in our homes and businesses. We help watch our neighbors' homes. We take care of our health.

But, as we all know, there are few guarantees. Tragedy can come upon us no matter what precautions we take. We have seen this over and over in the storm disasters of the past few weeks, or the mass shooting sprees in theaters, supermarkets, schools and workplaces. The things of this world can provide supports for safety, but none of them can make us totally secure. Security ultimately comes from God alone. The power of God is stronger than any theft, accident or injury. It rules over illness and death. The power that created us will re-create us in love.

Today, we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. It is the last Sunday in Ordinary Time and it celebrates the unique mystery of Jesus' kingship, with his throne being the Cross. Throughout the Scriptures, Jesus had a favorite image for himself. He called himself the *Son of Man*, an expression he took from the Old Testament Book of Daniel. In that Book the prophet envisioned one like a Son of Man coming on the clouds of heaven. He receives dominion, glory and kingship. All the nations served him and his rule extended over all the lands and times.

In borrowing that image, Jesus gave us a message of hope. He himself would lose security by suffering torment and death on the Cross. But he himself would reign over all. And so, the church year ends with a vision of hope for each one of us who seeks security. The coming of the *Son of Man* into our lives is the only real security we can count on.
