Several years ago, my friend Fr. Ron and I discovered an abandoned bird's nest in a tree in our front yard. After making sure it was truly abandoned, we took it down and saved it. Ever since then it has become one of our annual Advent decorations.

One might ask, "What does a bird's nest have to do with Advent?" Actually, it is a perfect symbol for this season. Just think about what a bird's nest is. It is the place which a mother bird creates for her eggs. (Our nest has a wide variety of elements, including pieces of scotch tape!) There they rest until the day they hatch and new life begins. She is attentive and expectant, protecting them and caring for them until that eventful day arrives. Then the babies stay there, being fed and nurtured by her until she urges them out of the nest and they fly on their own.
