REFLECTION FOR THIS WEEKENDS READINGS

"When John came to you in the way of righteousness, you did not believe him; but tax collectors and prostitutes did." Mt 21:28-32 A preacher gave his congregation a simple rule to live a good and happy life. He said, "Turn right and go straight." Implicit in that simple truth is the need for each



person to make a free will decision to choose to do right rather than wrong, to do good rather than evil. Jesus tells a parable that calls us to discern God's will and make a free will decision to choose to do God's will even if it is inconvenient, unpleasant or risky. The father told one son to go work in the vineyard; he said "No!" but had a change of heart and went. The second son said "Yes sir!" but did not go. Jesus teaches us that our first response to God's will for us may be "No!", but our final response to God must be "Yes." Doing God's will may not be easy, it can be challenging. For many Catholics and Christians around the world today it involves losing all worldly possessions and is a matter of life and death. But to be true disciples of Jesus we have no choice but to "Turn right and go straight." and say "Yes!" to God.
