CROSS ABOVE THE ALTAR

Brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus, you may already have noticed a very significant change at our beloved St. Joseph Church. It has been decided that the cross of the resurrected Christ that hung over the altar in Church be moved to the back of the Church. We have been used to seeing the cross over our altar for many years. It was donated to the Church by a wonderful and faith-filled family and has served us well over the years. The decision to move the cross was made for three reasons: 1) Church regulations and rubrics (*a direction in a liturgical book as to how a church service should be conducted*). 2) Proper theology and most importantly, 3) The effectiveness of Mass in our lives.

First, let us talk about rules. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) states in paragraph 117 and 122 that "a cross with a figure of Christ crucified" be placed on or near the altar. Secondly, Christ died on a cross and was resurrected in a tomb-not on a cross. This may seem silly to have to state but it does have significance. In Mathew 27:40 when the crowds says to Jesus to come down for the cross, he chooses to stay up on the cross that we may be saved form our sins. When we look at a crucifix, it should remind us that "the wages of sin is death…", (Romans 6:23) and that we too must carry our own cross to follow Christ (Luke 14:27). Thirdly, the purpose of the Mass is to make present the One True Sacrifice of Christ on the Cross to us today in an unbloody manner. As Catholics, we are not just to sit idly during the Eucharistic Prayer. In fact, we should be assisting at Mass by calling to mind the Passion of our Lord and His sacrifice on the Cross. We are aided by having a crucifix above the altar. It also reminds us that WE must die to the world if WE are to be resurrected with Christ. Then with "great love and tender pity" we can contemplate the precious wounds of Our Lord.

Now we have placed the crucifix above the altar which was given to us by the Christians from the Holy Land. Our future plan is to replace this with another one which we have to purchase and will be expensive. If we all like the present one, we will keep it the same or with your donation we will get another one.
