Perhaps Palm Sunday should be called "Strange Sunday." We begin by praising the Lord with shouts of Hosanna, a Hebrew word of praise difficult to translate but which is not far from our word "hooray!" We welcome Jesus and rejoice at his presence among us. But no less than 20 minutes later we shout: "Crucify Him!" as we read the passion. We are fickle and inconsistent and our behavior is downright strange at times. Who would blame the Lord refusing to die for the likes of us? But on this strange Sunday of contrasts, we see that he willingly dies for us and though he could have brought down legions of Angels to destroy us for what we attempted he did not do so but instead spoke on our behalf: "Father forgive them." Ask for the grace to let it finally dawn on you that the Son of God died for you; not just as an intellectual fact but as a heartfelt experience. The strangeness of this Day cannot eclipse the strength of his love.
