Jesus Christ Is Lord!

Almighty Father, you provided your Son with a well-trained tongue to speak a word to rouse us. Our words and actions have betrayed him during the times that we have lost our way. We have sung "Hosannas," and then turned our backs on Christ. Strengthen us during this Holy Week that we might watch and pray as your Son journeys to the Cross. Sustain us as we seek the way with our Mother Mary, Mary Magdalene, and Mary of Salome, and draw us ever nearer to the life you offer. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Sunday, March 29, 2015 A Time of Paradox

Today's Readings: Mark 11:1-10; Isaiah 50:4-7; Psalm 22:8-9, 17-18, 19-20, 23-24 (2a); Philippians 2:6-11; Mark 14:1—15:47. We enter Holy Week with a mix of emotions. Here we face contradiction. In the reading for the Gospel procession, the crowds wave palm branches but in the Passion narrative, Jesus is whipped. We hear of the cries of "hosanna" but also of "crucify him." We can visualize a donkey being brought for Jesus to ride and also his crowning with thorns. Jesus is honored and then mocked; he rides triumphant and then is led out to be crucified. His disciples dine with him and then betray and deny him.

In the Suffering Servant depicted in the reading from Isaiah, we can see Jesus in his Passion. Just as did the Servant, Jesus gave his back to those who beat him and did not shield his face from those who spat on him. The reading, too, recalls Jesus, who upon beginning his ministry unfurled the scroll in the temple and read that the Lord has sent him "to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor" (Luke 4:19).

The reading from Philippians portrays Jesus as the essence of holiness. Though God, Jesus is willing to be humble, to be obedient. Jesus empties himself to do the will of the Father. We, too, are to empty ourselves, to turn over our being to God, to humbly be obedient to his will. Have our Lenten practices taught us this? Will we be able to enter Easter Time resolved to put our trust in God. Will we pray as Jesus does in the Gospel, "Abba, Father, for you all things are possible."



Blessing of Easter Foods: In many Eastern European countries, it is a tradition to have a basket of food blessed on Holy Saturday.

The Tradition ... what's it all about?

When many of our Eastern European Ancestors came to this country a century ago, they brought with them some beautiful traditions which added a particular beauty to the Easter Holydays. Among the most popular is the Traditional Blessing of the Foods that would be eaten on Easter morning. After a strict Lenten fast and

abstinence, specially prepared foods were made in advance for the blessing. A family basket would be filled with these foods and then covered with a crocheted cloth. Often the cloth had an Easter emblem or the words 'Christ is Risen' crocheted on it.

It sounds much like the special foods which our Jewish brothers and sisters use in the celebration of their Seder Meal.

Remember, the basket does not contain ALL the food you will eat on Easter Sunday...just a symbolic portion.

Prayer for Peace in the world, Church



My Brothers and Sisters,

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday and the start of Holy Week, a day that marks Jesus' triumphant entry into the city of Jerusalem. It's a journey that will ultimately lead Jesus to Calvary. Scripture tells us that Jesus arrived in Jerusalem riding on a donkey, and that people lined the

streets laying their coats upon the ground and waving palms as he made his way through the streets. Have you ever wondered why palms were used to welcome Jesus? Why did he ride a donkey? Wouldn't a horse have been a better animal for our Savior to ride? What type of greeting was this?

Palms were used in the ancient world to mark the arrival of a triumphant king who brought victory in his wake. In Roman times, crowds would gather to honor the emperor and his soldiers for the defeat of their enemies. Jesus enters the city of Jerusalem as a triumphant king whose victory will not be over a political power, but over death and sin. In this way, the use of palms to welcome Jesus is a foreshadowing of Christ's resurrection and victory over sin and death. It also points to the opening chapters of Mark's Gospel, where Jesus proclaims that, "the Kingdom of God is at hand". The palms mark the reality that God's Kingdom is now!

Symbolically, palms were signs of peace, abundant life, and Divine goodness. In the *1*st *Book of Kings*, we hear how the Temple of the Lord was adorned with engravings of palms as a representation of the Lord's desire for peace among his people. Images of paradise are beset by palms and harken back to Eden before the fall. Jesus is the true Temple of the Lord, the gateway to paradise, and the new Adam, and thus, it is fitting that the people would bring palms to adorn him as the King of Peace and Eternal Life.

We might understand all of this and how it points to Jesus' kingship, but why a donkey? Horses were always an animal used in war within the ancient world. They were examples of military strength and power. Jesus is humble and obedient to the will of God. God's will for his people is to live in peace and security. It fulfills the prophesy of Zachariah when he says, "Exult greatly, O daughter Zion! Shout for joy, O daughter Jerusalem! Behold: your king is coming to you, a just savior is he, humble, and riding on a donkey." Jesus comes to create a world of peace and calls on us to do the same in his name. Let us therefore work through prayer and action for a more just world where peace can touch the hearts of all men in Christ's name - Amen.


