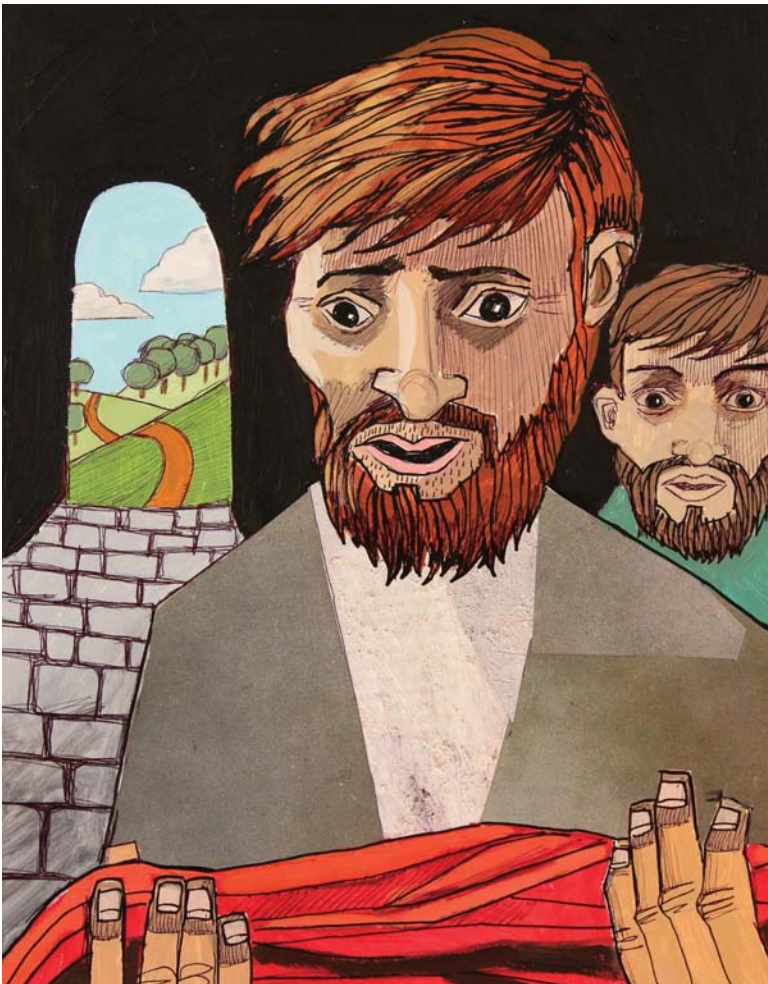


# EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

Today’s Readings: Acts 10:34a, 37-43; Ps 118; Col. 3:1–4 or 1 Cor. 5:6-8; Jn 20:1-9, (or Luke 24:13-35)

As we sing alleluias once again, as we hear of Christ’s rising from the dead, it seems that our lives have pointed to this day. Indeed, our lives are focused on the Resurrection. This is the major feast day of the Church, for Christ came to die and rise from the dead for us. From that dying and rising, we have new life in Christ; we are united with God.

Our churches, then, are decorated in gold and white, colors of new life and rejoicing. In the Responsorial Psalm, we sing, “This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad,” for our lives are centered on this day. It is the day that provides hope for us. We are not dead because of our sin but forgiven because of God’s mercy.

In the reading from the Acts of the Apostles, St. Peter summarizes what he has witnessed. Jesus was anointed, hanged, raised from the dead, and made visible to his followers. These followers preach, continuing to tell the story of the one who forgives sins. It is clear from this reading that Peter’s life has been changed. He now traces events and sees their culmination in the Resurrection. What meaning does the Resurrection have in your life? Are you open to its giving you a new perspective? Embrace the life that we have, because of the life that He gave!

## FROM YOUR PASTOR

Blessed Easter!

Again we gather to celebrate Easter Sunday.

We have done it for so

many years. Some of us for over 80 years, others among us for 40 or 20 years, and for some little ones, it may be the first Easter which they will not remember in the future. Many things change in our lives. As we journey along the passing years of our lives, we are faced with joys, sufferings, disappointments, successes and so on. Life constantly invites us to make choices. Some of them are for better and some of them are for worse. We grow older and that process cannot be reversed no matter how much we may try. Hopefully, with age comes wisdom, more understanding, and a larger perspective on life.

No matter what the story of your life is, and it does matter; the message of Easter is still the same. It is a message of life, overcoming death. It is a message of new beginning that God offers to us each day. It reminds us that obstacles in life can be overcome. It gives us hope, knowing that my life does not belong to me alone, but is hidden in God who is love. To live a "life of a beloved," of myself as loved unconditionally by God and to base everything on that experience and conviction is to live a new life. The most powerful message of Easter is the message of "New Life," new life in God and in Christ!

The idea of new life can mean different things to different people. It may be pointing to new beginning. It may be challenging us to let go and not cling to the past. New life may be knocking into our hearts inviting us to not dwell on disappointments, broken dreams, or promises that we have not fulfilled. New life may be asking me to muster the courage to die to something in my life that is "life-taking." Unless I have courage to die to that, whatever it may be, new life cannot begin.

Remember, Jesus saying: *"unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit," (John 12:22). Easter calls us to live lives that bear fruits of love, life, compassion and mercy. If we can make those gifts available, miracles of new life will take place. Easter will continue. We will be able to live lives that are "risen," that is, risen above the petty, self-centered, and competitive world in which we live.*

Easter is about God wanting to breath new life in me and renew my spirit.

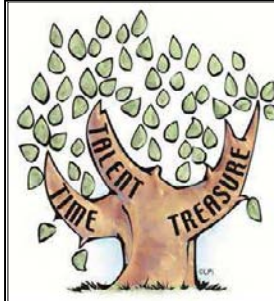

The making of a Prayer Shawl is a spiritual experience for the shawl maker and many blessings are prayed into every shawl while it is being made. At each monthly Prayer Shawl Ministry session, the shawl makers pray over the completed shawls and the shawls-in-progress. In addition to the individual and the group prayers, these Prayer Shawls receive more prayers from our parishioners during a blessing at Mass. These soft knitted and crocheted shawls contain many prayers for the recipient – hence the name, “Prayer Shawl.”

This is an on-going ministry. Requests can be made at any time. Each shawl is a tangible sign of God's love and comfort for the recipient. The shawl makers feel blessed to be able to offer their prayers and their shawls in order to provide comfort and peace to others. Please keep our ministry and shawl makers in your prayers.

## This Week At Home

### Monday, April 6: No Need to Fear

"Do not be afraid!" Jesus greets the women with these words in today's Gospel. The same words were said to Mary at the Annunciation and to the shepherds as the angels heralded the birth of the Lord. Today we know that the Lord is risen and with us. Still, we often are afraid of what is ahead of us. During this season, we may want to try to practice trusting in the Lord as we rejoice that he has risen and is always present in our lives. Acts 2:14, 22-33; Ps 16; Matthew 28:8-15

### Tuesday, April 7: Called by God

How easy it is to miss the Lord when our focus is on ourselves. At first Mary did not recognize the Lord because she was concentrating on the empty tomb and her grief. Yet it took only being called by name for her to see the Lord. The Lord calls each of us to him. Do we recognize the Lord's call in Word, in sacrament, and in members of the Body of Christ? Acts 2:36-41; Ps 33; John 20:11-18

### Wednesday, April 8: Telling the Good News

In today's Gospel, we hear that two disciples walked many miles with Jesus and then finally recognized him in the breaking of the bread. The early Christians used the term "breaking of the bread" for Eucharist. Having recognized Jesus, these disciples ran to spread the message. How does the Eucharist nourish you to tell others of the life that you live in Christ? Acts 3:1-10; Ps 105; Luke 24:13-35

### Thursday, April 9: Peace Be With You

We hear in today's Gospel that Jesus' first words to the Apostles were those of peace. The Apostles were a troubled group. They had followed Jesus for three years, but could not make sense of his death. Wishing them peace, Jesus explains the Scriptures to them, showing them that his death fulfilled the prophecies. We should seek to rest in Jesus when we are troubled. Does it help to know that he wishes us peace? Acts 3:11-26; Ps 8; Luke 24:35-48

### Friday, April 10: An Overwhelming Love

An abundance of fish filled the net as soon as Jesus told the Apostles to cast their net to the side of the boat. Could the fish in today's narrative from John be likened to the overwhelming love that God has for us? In today's Gospel, Christ feeds the Apostles, sharing bread and fish with them. God continues to nourish and share himself in Sacrament, in Word, and in the Faithful...his Body on earth today. Acts 4:1-12; Ps 118; John 21:1-14

### Saturday, April 11: Saturday within the Octave of Easter

We hear in today's Gospel of the reluctance of the Apostles to believe that Jesus had risen. They disregarded the Good News from Mary Magdalene and from the disciples who met Jesus along the road. Appearing before the disciples, Jesus commands them to spread the Gospel. Have you taken that message to heart? Acts 4:13-21; Ps 118; Mark 16:9-15
