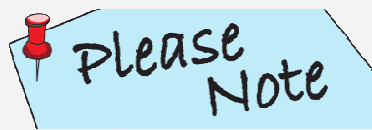

Our Scripture readings this week speak to the fact that we are all called to conversion in light of Jesus' Ascension into Heaven. As the disciples of Jesus witnessed his ascending to the Father, Angels remind the disciples that they must be on their way to spread the good news they have beheld. "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky," remark the men clothed in white garments? In other words, "Hey – get going! This is not a spectators sport. You have work to do now." Who are the men of Galilee? Who are Jesus' disciples? WE ARE. We are called to heed the message of Jesus to his disciples found in the Gospel of Mark, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." We are called to engage in acts of mercy which reflect the love Christ has for his people. These acts of mercy are divided into two categories: Corporal and Spiritual.

Corporal Works of Mercy:

- Feed the Hungry
- Give drink to the thirsty
- Clothe the naked
- Give shelter to the homeless
- Visit the sick
- Ransom the captive
- Bury the Dead

Spiritual Works of Mercy:

- Instruct the ignorant
- Counsel the doubtful
- Admonish sinners
- Bear wrongs patiently
- Forgive offenses
- Comfort the afflicted
- Pray for the living and the dead.

In light of Jesus' resurrection and ascension into Heaven, we are called engage in both corporal and spiritual acts of mercy, with those among us and in the world at large. Let us pray that Jesus will give us the strength to begin this work as his disciples.

This Week At Home

Monday, May 18: Our Refuge

Though they try, the Apostles in today's Gospel cannot yet understand what Jesus is saying. They may grasp what he means when he says "the hour is coming" or that they will leave him alone. Still, he offers them consolation by telling them, "in me you may have peace." We, too, can be consoled by this. At times, we will seem alone; however, we can always take refuge in Christ. Acts 19:1-8; Ps 68; John 16:29-33

Tuesday, May 19: Glory in the Cross

In today's Gospel, Jesus shows his readiness for the Cross as he prays that the Father glorify him. The discourse notes that Christ already has been glorified in his followers, who have received Jesus' words and know that all comes from the Father, "Now this is eternal life, that they should know you, the only true God, and the one whom you sent, Jesus Christ." Acts 20:17-27; Psalm 68; John 17:1-11a

Wednesday, May 20: St. Bernadine of Siena, Priest

St. Bernadine (1380-1444) certainly carried out Paul's instructions in today's reading from Acts. He tended the flock in many ways. As a young man, he traveled on foot throughout parts of Italy, preaching devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus. Taking a break from traveling, he wrote on theology and established schools to teach the friars. Within two years before his death, he returned to preaching and died while preaching on his way to Naples. Acts 20:28-38; Psalm 68; John 17: 11-19

Thursday, May 21: St. Christopher Magallenes, Priest, and Companions, Martyrs

Today we honor twenty-two priests and three lay people killed during the religious persecution in Mexico between 1915 and 1937. Christopher Magallenes, whose name represents the group, was targeted after he taught seminarians displaced when the government closed seminaries. He and the other martyrs tended to the sacramental needs of Catholics while opposing the use of violence. Acts 22:30; 23:6-11; Psalm 16; John 17:20-26

Friday, May 22: St. Rita of Cascia, Religious

Rita of Cascia (1377-1457), an Italian Augustinian nun, is the patron of abused wives and mourning women. She had been abused by her husband, and after his death and the death of their two sons, entered the Augustinian Order. In today's Gospel, Jesus gives three commands to Peter. He tells him to "feed my lambs," "tend my sheep," and "follow me." St. Rita followed Jesus as she cared for sick nuns and counseled individuals. How is Christ calling you to act in the world when he says, "feed my lambs"? Acts 25: 13-21; Psalm 103; John 21:15-19

Saturday, May 23: Follow Me

It can be helpful to see that Jesus' first followers were sometimes caught up in their all too human concerns. Jesus has just told Peter to follow him when Peter asks about John. Jesus instructs Peter not to be concerned about John's role and again says, "follow me." We need to stay focused on how we follow Jesus. Concentrating on another's path will be a detriment to our own vocation. Acts 28:16-20, 30-31; Ps 114; John 21:20-25
