Tentatively Planned Work Schedule

A tentative work schedule for 20657 Woodburn is as follows:

1. April 22—Saturday, wash kitchen, need 2 people as kitchen is small.
2. April 26—Pick up needed supplies from Lowes and start patching holes if possible
3. April 27—Paint kitchen, finish patching holes, pick up doors if available
4. April 28—Pull up tile floor in kitchen, lay tile in kitchen, hall/laundry room and entrance hall. Paint living room, halls, bathrooms, repair fence and yard clean up
5. April 30—Finish up all of the work.
