Calendar Alert: Christmas 2017

According to Canon Law, "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation, the faithful are obligated to participate in the Mass. This year the Fourth Sunday of Advent falls on December 24, Christmas falls on Monday, December 25. Some people are asking: Can I satisfy both obligations by attending Mass on the evening of December 23?

The prevailing view of canon lawyers is that each obligation must be fulfilled by attending a separate Mass, one for the 4th Sunday of Advent and one for Christmas: the Nativity of the Lord.

Making a Report of Sexual Abuse

To inform the Archdiocese of Detroit regarding the sexual abuse of minors by priests, deacons and other Church personnel and/or to speak to the Victim Assistance Coordinator contact: (866) 343-8055. A caller will be requested to provide his or her name and telephone number. All calls regarding complaints of sexual abuse will be returned in a timely manner. This toll-free number has been established as part of an effort by the Detroit archdiocese to protect children, young people and other vulnerable people in our schools, parishes and ministries. This line is for reporting suspected sexual misconduct or child abuse within archdiocesan institutions and ministries only. Persons with such complaints are also encouraged to directly contact law enforcement authorities.

MINUTE MEDITATIONS Say yes even in the midst of darkness

In Matthew's version of the annunciation story, in this case telling Joseph that the events in his life are part of God's plan, we can imagine what Joseph has been going through. We've had similar difficulties in our own lives. At this time, we may have longed for a sign as clear as the one Matthew describes.

Pope Francis reminds us that at times such as these, we need to have a kind of desperate faith that says yes in the midst of darkness. What helps more than anything is to be immersed in the stories of the Bible, the stories of God's presence with his people.
