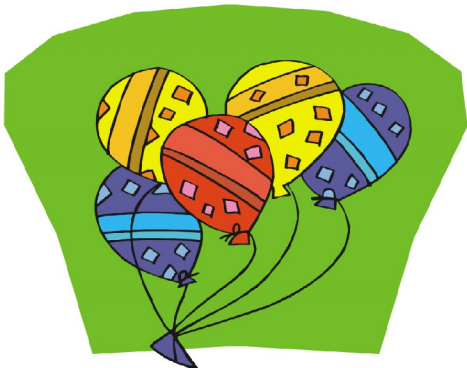

Over 70-and-a half?

What you need to know about the IRA charitable gift rollover

Today Congress extended the favorable IRA charitable rollover tax provisions for 2015 and made them permanent for future years. The President has said he will sign the legislation. What should a donor over age 70½ do in order to get the benefit that IRA distributions will not be included in taxable income? Donors should follow the same general procedures for IRA charitable distributions as in the past —

- Only direct distributions to charity up to \$100,000 qualify as tax-free. Distributions in exchange for a charitable gift annuity or to a charitable remainder trust would not qualify.

- It is especially important that the IRA distribution be made payable to the charity, not to you as the IRA owner and beneficiary. Otherwise, the distribution would not qualify for the favorable tax treatment.
- Only distributions from traditional or certain Roth IRAs would be tax-free; the law does not apply to other qualified retirement plans, such as 401(k) plans. However, you should consider consulting with your financial or tax advisor about the possibility of transferring funds from one of these other qualified plans to establish an IRA, with distribution to charity coming from the newly established IRA.
- Consult with your IRA administrator on the proper procedures for making a direct distribution to your parish, the Archdiocese of Detroit Endowment Foundation, the Catholic Services Appeal, Sacred Heart Major Seminary, Catholic Charities of Southeast Michigan or another archdiocesan institution.

“It's been a terrible year for abortion rights-but here is opportunity to be found amid the setbacks.”

That's the sober assessment of Michelle Goldberg, *writing in the Slate*, about how 2015 went for abortion supporters.

Her article focuses on several things, including the continued trend of prolife legislation passing in states. Michigan is no different. As we reach the end of 2015, two major initiatives include the coercive Abortion Prevention Act (CAPA) and the Dismemberment Abortion Ban are being considered by our Legislature.

CAPA would add protections to women who are coerced into having abortions. Dismemberment abortions, like partial-birth abortions, are violent late-term techniques to end human life.

The opportunity that Goldberg mentions could be more of an opportunity for proliferers. Abortion supporters hope that by talking about abortion more openly, even celebrating it, they can change the conversation.

In the past, organizations like Planned Parenthood and pro-abortion politicians have done everything they could to avoid mentioning abortion. Abortion thrives when it's not talked about and people don't understand the violence it entails.

In 2016, we must continue to speak the truth about what abortion is. We must continue to teach people about the value of life and the development of the child in the womb. We will celebrate – not lament – the fact that abortions are at their lowest since 1973.

BABY SAFE HAVEN

Too often we hear of newborn babies being left abandoned in dumpsters, alleys or parks. Michigan, like all the other states, has a Safe Haven Law whereby a mother can leave her newborn (up to 3 days old) at a hospital, fire station, police station or church without the legal entanglements of abandonment or abuse. If the woman/girl feels that she simply cannot assume the responsibilities of motherhood, leaving her baby at one of the facilities assures that her baby will be well cared for, loved and freed for adoption. Women's Christmas Dinner Recipes

Numerous ladies, who attended the Transfiguration Women's Christmas dinner asked if the recipes could be published. This is certainly something we are happy to do. Enjoy.....

Hot Chicken Salad

- 2 cups cooked chicken breast, shredded (we used Costco packaged rotisserie chicken - white and dark meat)
- 1 cup diced celery
- 3/4 cup slivered almonds, lightly toasted
- 1/2 teaspoon white pepper
- 1 Tablespoon lemon juice
- 1 cup Hellman's Light mayonnaise
- 1/3 cup sour cream
- 1 to 1 1/2 cups shredded parmesan cheese
- 1 cup dried cranberries
- 1 small can fried onions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees, and spray a 9 x 11 baking dish with cooking spray. Combine all ingredients together. Transfer to baking dish and cook for 20 – 30 minutes.

Broccoli Salad

from Trudy Barone's recipe in "What's Cooking at St Michael"

- 2 bunches of broccoli, cut into bite size pieces
- 1 cup raisins (I prefer golden raisins)
- 1 cup finely chopped red onions
- 1 lb bacon, cooked crisply and crumbled
- 1 cup sunflower seeds

Dressing:

- 1 cup mayo or Miracle Whip salad dressing
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 Tbs vinegar

Combine all ingredients. Mix dressing in a separate bowl and mix well with other ingredients. Chill before serving, if possible.

Apple/Berry Fruit Salad

- 2 bunches romaine lettuce, chopped
- 2 banana sliced
- 2 honey crisp apples cored and diced (leave peeling on)
- 1 pint blackberries

Dressing:

- 1 cup Mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 Tbs vinegar

(Yes, it's the same dressing as used in the broccoli salad, but it ends up with a different taste due to the different ingredients used in the two salads.)

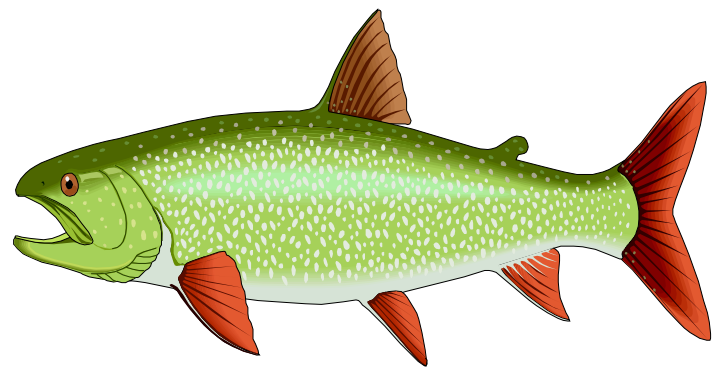

SAINT OF THE WEEK

HILARY OF POITIERS

315–368

Feast—January 13



This bishop and theologian, a highly cultivated pagan who became a Christian, was elected bishop of his native Poitiers, in France, at age thirty-five, while his wife was still living. For his unwavering opposition to Arianism, the heresy that Jesus Christ was in some way subordinate to God, he was banished to Asia Minor in 356 by an Arian emperor. But he continued to study Greek theology

and oppose Arianism and was sent back to France for being a “mischief-maker.” He left extensive writings and was named a Doctor of the Church in 1851.



CATECHETICAL CORNER

DYING AND RISING WITH CHRIST

Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life.

—Rom 6:3-4

Baptism is birth into the new life in Christ. In accordance with the Lord’s will, it is necessary for salvation, as is the Church herself, which we enter by Baptism.

—CCC, no. 1277

In his dialogue with Nicodemus, Jesus taught that Baptism was necessary for salvation. “No one can enter the Kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit” (Jn 3:5). After his Resurrection, Jesus met with the eleven Apostles and gave them the commission to preach the Gospel and baptize, telling them, “Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved” (Mk 16:16). The word baptism in its origins is Greek and means “immersion” and “bath.” Immersion in water is a sign of death, and emersion out of the water means new life. To bathe in water is also to undergo cleansing. St. Paul sums up this truth when he says, “You were buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead” (Col 2:12).

The origin and foundation of Christian Baptism is Jesus. Before starting his public ministry, Jesus submitted himself to the

baptism given by John the Baptist. The waters did not purify him; he cleansed the waters. “He comes to sanctify the Jordan for our sake . . . to begin a new creation through the Spirit and water” (St. Gregory Nazianzen, *Liturgy of the Hours*, I, 634). Jesus’ immersion in the water is a sign for all human beings of the need to die to themselves to do God’s will. Jesus did not need to be baptized because he was totally faithful to the will of his Father and free



from sin. However, he wanted to show his solidarity with human beings in order to reconcile them to the Father. By commanding his disciples to baptize all nations, he established the means by which people would die to sin—Original and actual—and begin to live a new life with God.

MOMENT OF MERCY

JANUARY 2016

When we think about pilgrimages, we probably think about medieval people walking great distances to awe-inspiring churches. Yet, Pope Francis describes what is at the heart of pilgrimage and encourages us to each make one during this Jubilee of Mercy. He writes that “life itself is a pilgrimage, and the human being is a viator, a pilgrim traveling along the road, making his way to the desired destination” (MV, no. 14). Pope Francis encourages each of us to make a pilgrimage to the Holy Door in our diocese some time during this Jubilee of Mercy. Being committed to the journey of pilgrimage helps us focus our attention on our spiritual journey and walk closer with God. Similarly, our daily journey to live out the mercy of God “is also a goal to reach and requires dedication and sacrifice” (MV, no. 14).

1. With your family or a parish group, plan a pilgrimage to the Holy Door within your diocese for some time during this year.
2. Each day, give yourself one small goal of mercy, compassion, and love to journey toward—for example, being kind to a difficult coworker—so that, by those actions, you are able to walk closer to God on the pilgrimage of Christian life.
