Wednesday, February 14, marks the beginning of Lent with Ash Wednesday. A good way to begin the Lenten Season is with Mass and the re-

ception of Holy Communion. For your convenience, there will be two Masses on Ash Wednesday, along with the reception of Holy (blessed) Ashes, distributed during each Mass. Masses will be celebrated at 8:10 AM and 7:00 PM. Please make a sincere effort to attend Mass.

Ash Wednesday Mass at High Hill will be at 7:00 AM, Ammannsville will be at 5:30 PM and Holman at 6:30 PM.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of both fast and abstinence. In the United States the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

The law of abstinence obliges those 14 years of age and older not to eat meat. The law of fast obliges all those from ages 18 through 59 to refrain from eating between meals and to limit their eating to one full meal and two lighter meals for the day.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS AND BENEDICTION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Each Friday during Lent we will have an evening Mass at 6:00; followed by Stations of the Cross and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. 
