Please make every attempt to be on time – or even early. Due to circumstances out of our control, we understand that there are times when you can't get to church before it starts, but remember it is better to be present, even if late, that it is to absent from the assembly of faith.

Leaving church before the dismissal is to ignore an important part of the Liturgy: Christ's commission to "...go out and make disciples of all nations." Our Liturgy has a beginning, "in the name of the Father...", and an end, "Let us go in peace to love and serve the Lord..." We encourage you to receive your commission with dignity, respect, and honor.


