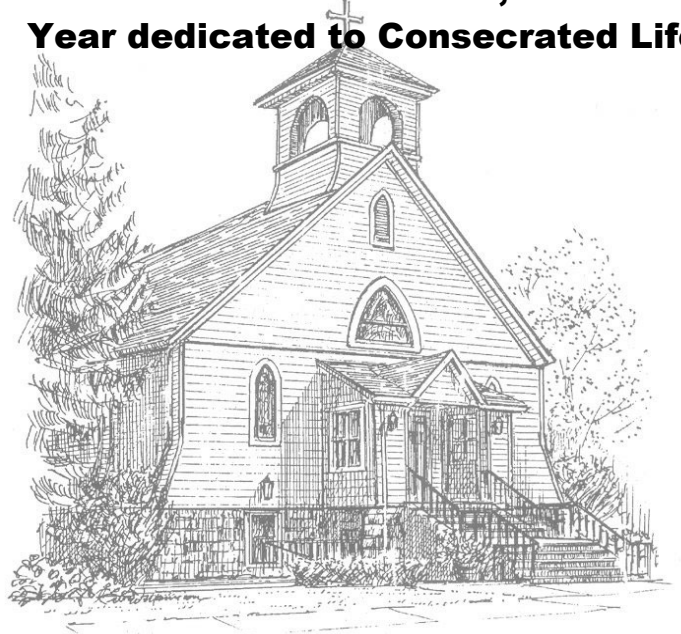

YOUR PERSONAL CROSS

We all have crosses, and some we make ourselves. But all of us have a personal cross from God Himself, designed specifically for us. That cross, whether it is physical, mental, spiritual whatever it is, that particular cross is the main reason why you will be holy, and it indicates your glory in heaven. Your entire glory in heaven will be dependent on how you carried your cross. DID YOU KNOW?

The term "**bleeding heart**," often used in a derogatory sense when applied to image-conscious (read *hypocritical*) liberals, had a very Catholic and Incarnational origin. The term came into use not long after the revelations of our Lord to St. Margaret Mary concerning the wounds inflicted by sinful Catholics on His Sacred Heart. In the revelations given to the Visitation nun in 1675, our Lord opened His bosom and exposed before her eyes the very flesh of His human Heart wrapped in a ring of thorns and oozing droplets of His precious blood. "Behold," He said to the saint, "the Heart that has so loved men." Within Catholic Christendom of the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries, a "bleeding heart" was a heart consumed with true Christian charity for the poor and sick.

TRUE DANGER

Christ didn't land on the Cross by playing it safe with the high priests of His day. In view of the corrupt system outlined above, when people ask about the sex abuse crisis, "How could this have happened?" the only answer is, "How could it not have happened?" when whistle-blowers were punished and abusers honored or at least coddled. The only response is "Thank God it happened!" Not thank God children were abused, but thank God the corrupt system that allowed it to continue was blown sky high. It is only the beginning, but it may well be the deliverance so many of us have been praying for.

Recalling the famous vision of Pope Leo XIII where he saw God grant Satan's request of 100 years to destroy the Church, and chose the 20th century, was it an accident that this particular stronghold collapsed two years into the 21st century? Judgment begins with the House of God (1 Peter 4:17). Thank God. What does this all have to do with contraception? Contraception was the epicenter of the "sexual revolution." Contraception was also the epicenter of the movement for dissent against Church teaching, Humanae Vitae in particular, and the center of most of the fiercest battles in the Church today. Contraception, abortion and homosexuality are the three legs of the stool upon which the Culture of Death sits.

LYME DISEASE

The summer season is upon us, and now that we can start enjoying the outdoors, we should also be aware that it is also Lyme Disease season.

Lyme Disease is an infectious disease that causes joint pain and inflammation, as well as heart and nerve complications. The disease was first recognized in 1975 in Lyme, Connecticut, when a cluster of patients developed a strange type of arthritis. The disease is spread by the bite of deer ticks, smaller than common dog ticks. They are found on deer, birds and rodents.

Early Lyme symptoms include fatigue, chills, fever, headache, swollen lymph nodes, muscle and joint pain and a characteristic skin rash. The rash is a red circular patch that appears three days to a month after the bite, and the center may become clear as it enlarges, resulting in a "bullseye" appearance. Lyme disease is often difficult to diagnose because the symptoms mimic other diseases. A new test called PCR (polymerase chain-reaction) can be done to detect the disease in its early stages.

If you spend a lot of time outdoors near woods, you may consider talking to your physician about a new vaccine called LYMERix. It can be given in early spring, and it consists of taking three doses over a one-year period.

Lyme Disease can be avoided by taking the following precautions:

- Wear long sleeved shirts, long pants tucked into socks, and closed shoes in tick infested areas.
- Shower soon after coming indoors (the ticks take several hours to attack).
- Use skin repellents containing DEET.
- If bitten, remove the tick immediately by grasping it as close to the skin as possible with tweezers and tugging gently.

As Catholics, we are to be rooted within a parish community, where we are obligated to come and be fed on God's Word in Scripture and on Christ's Body and Blood in the Eucharist at least once a week. What happened to the Apostles after Pentecost?

The fate of Jesus' Apostles is as follows:

St. Matthew was slain with a sword in Ethiopia.

St. Mark expired in Alexandria, after being cruelly dragged through that city.

St. Peter was crucified upside down in Rome.

St. James the Greater was beheaded in Jerusalem.

St. James the Lesser was thrown from a tower and beaten to death with clubs.

St. Philip was hung on a pillar at the Heiropolis in Phrygia.

St. Bartholomew was flayed alive.

St. Andrew was bound to a cross until he died.

St. Thomas was run through with a lance at Coromandel in the East Indies.

St. Jude Thaddeus was shot to death with arrows.

St. Matthias (who replaced Judas) was first stoned and then beheaded.

St. Barnabas was stoned to death by the Jews at Solonica.

Judas Iscariot committed suicide.

St. Paul was beheaded in Rome by Emperor Nero.

St. John was put into a caldron of boiling oil, but miraculously escaped death. He was banished to the island of Patmos where he died of natural causes.

The REAL PRESENCE

On the evening of the last day of his October 1995 visit to the United States, John Paul II was scheduled to greet the seminarians at Saint Mary's Seminary in Baltimore. It had been a very full day that began with a Mass at Oriole Park in Camden Yards; a parade through downtown streets; a visit to the Basilica of the Assumption, the first cathedral in the country; lunch at a local soup kitchen run by Catholic Charities; a prayer service at the Cathedral of Mary Our Queen in North Baltimore; and finally a quick stop at Saint Mary's Seminary. The schedule was simply to greet the seminarians while they stood outside on the steps.

But the Pope made his way through their ranks and into the building. His plan was to first make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament. When his wishes were made known, security flew into action. They swept the building, paying close attention to the chapel where the Pope would be praying. For this purpose, highly trained dogs were used to detect any person who might be present. The dogs are trained to locate survivors in collapsed buildings after "earthquakes and other disaster." These highly intelligent and eager dogs quickly went through the halls offices and classrooms and were then sent to the chapel. They went up and down the aisles, past the pews and finally into the side chapel where the Blessed Sacrament is reserved. Upon reaching the tabernacle, the dogs sniffed, whined, pointed, and refused to leave, their attention riveted on the tabernacle, until called by their handlers. They were convinced that they discovered someone there. We Catholics know they were right – they found a real living Person in the tabernacle.

RESPECT LIFE

At the instant of physical conception, a human life is in existence. To deliberately kill or destroy that human life, THE GREAT LAWGIVER AND SUPREME JUDGE says, is **MURDER**, punishable by eternal and final **DEATH!** Regardless of human lawyers, human courts, human judges, or even Supreme Court Justices, abortion is an act of murder, in defiance of the supreme almighty GOD. THE REAL NAME

The original name of Los Angeles, California, as a Franciscan mission, was El Pueblo de Nuestra Senora la Reina de los Angeles de Porciuncula (The Village of our Lady Queen of the Angels of the Portiuncula). The Portiuncula was the original chapel built by Saint Francis of Assisi after receiving God's command to "rebuild My Church." The seal of the city of Los Angeles is encircled by a seven-decade rosary, which was the traditional number of decades on the Franciscan crown. The late Walter O'Malley, the first owner of the L.A. Dodgers, said that when he designed Dodger stadium he surrounded the park with cypress trees in seven groups of ten (one Our Father tree spaced between each) to honor our Lady's Rosary as it was portrayed on her city's seal.

Observing that attendance at the Sunday liturgy is "strikingly low", **Pope John Paul II** stated, "In the minds of many of the faithful, not only is the sense of the centrality of the Eucharist missing; even the sense of the duty to give thanks to the Lord and to pray to Him with others in the community of the Church seems to be diminishing."
