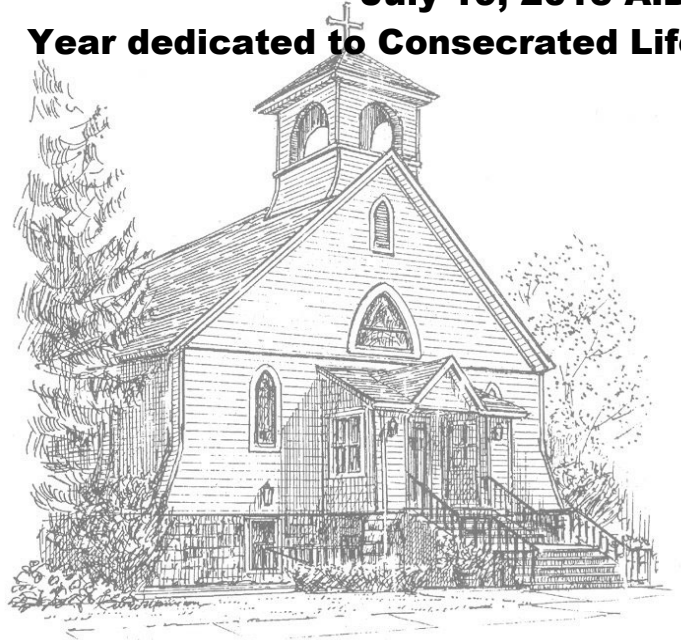

ALL LIFE IS ENDANGERED

In Deuteronomy 32:39 the Lord tells us: "It is I who bring both life and death." And in the Creed, we profess our belief in a God who is: "Father, Creator of all ... the Lord and Giver of life." Once the creature usurps the Creator's authority, we are on very shaky – and dangerous ground, and no one's life is safe and secure! Some may criticize this statement as being overly alarmist or unnecessarily frightening, but we need to face the facts:

In 1973, the church condemned the legalization of abortion in America – but many tried to mask the horror of the Supreme Court's decision by pointing out that 'legal abortion' was limited to the first trimester of pregnancy, and only for specific reasons. The Church strongly rejected this mistaken view by declaring that every life is sacred from the moment of conception – and that once death's door is controlled by human will rather than God's will, all life is endangered!

As we now see, the Church was prophetic: our courts now allow abortion-on-demand for any reason – even as the child emerges from the womb, as in so-called partial-birth abortion. Children can legally seek an abortion without their parent's permission, even through their public school – although that same school cannot give the child an aspirin without permission! The Clinton Administration ended the ban on using human fetuses for stem cell experimentation.

The elderly are denied adequate, affordable health care, and there is growing support for the legalization of assisted-suicide. Our young people are grossly misled by what they see in the media regarding marriage and sex; violence is rampant in our cities and our schools, and many see the death penalty as the only answer! Bl. John Paul II asked American Catholics [and all people of good will] to use our privilege to vote to replace this "culture of death" with the "Gospel of Life!"

In the Image of God

Before you argue about your dirty house someone didn't clean or sweep - think of the people who are living in the streets. Before whining about the distance you drive - think of someone who walks the same distance with their feet and when you are tired and complain about your job - think of the unemployed, the disabled, and those who wish they had your job. But before you think of pointing the finger or condemning another - remember that not one of us is without sin. And when depressing thoughts seem to get you down - put a smile on your face and think: you're alive and still around.

TICK REMEDY

A School Nurse has written the info' below -- good enough to share -- I had a pediatrician tell me what she believes is the best way to remove a tick. This is great, because it works in those places where it's sometimes difficult to get to with tweezers: between toes, in the middle of a head full of dark hair, etc. Apply a glob of liquid soap to a cotton ball. Cover the tick with the soap-soaked cotton ball and swab it for a few seconds (15-20), the tick will come out on its own and be stuck to the cotton ball when you lift it away. This technique has worked every time, and it's much less traumatic for the patient. **Unless someone is allergic to soap.**

NURSERY RHYMES

It is amazing but understandable that so few people today understand the background of these poems, or realize the reason why they were composed in the first place. For many these ridiculous jingles are simply for children's amusement, but nothing could be further from the truth. They were the products of the angry people of England who could not openly speak against their kings and still remain alive. It was through these clever verses that they were able to vent their frustrations and also spread the news about current events. Without using actual names but substituting familiar characteristics, the common English people were able to ridicule their kings, queens and clergymen, and still be able to keep their heads. The verses told the news-hungry Englishmen secret tales of court scandal, high political intrigue, religious strife and grim tragedy. The Mother Goose rhymes are actually a history book written by the peasantry of England. So every time you speak about Jack and Jill or Little Miss Muffet, you are repeating history from 16th and 17th England. **Humpty Dumpty sat on a wall; Humpty Dumpty has a great fall. Not all the King's horses, Not all the King's men, Could put Humpty Dumpty together again.** This little poem we've all heard before, and it actually lampooned the malformed, hunchbacked tyrant England's King Richard III. King Richard did sit on top of a precarious wall – the throne of England. He managed to keep his balance for two years, but in 1485, he and his rival for the throne Henry IV met in battle on Bosworth Field. This battle ended the Wars of the Roses and the life of Richard III. He lay wounded on the battlefield, falling off his horse and carrying out, "A horse! A horse! My kingdom for a horse." No one or horse could save King Richard from his fate. The Rhymers became particularly active when King Henry VIII, in order to divorce the Catholic Queen Catherine of Aragon and marry the Protestant Anne Boleyn, broke with the Roman Catholic Church and proclaimed himself head of the Church of England. **Sing a song of sixpence, A pocket full of rye, Four and twenty blackbirds baked in a pie; When the pie was opened the birds began to sing, Wasn't that a dainty dish to set before the King? The King was in the counting house counting out his money, The Queen was in the pantry eating bread and honey; the Maid was in the garden hanging out the clothes, when down flew a blackbird and snipped off her nose.** The meaning of this poem becomes clear as soon as the symbolic references are understood. The sixpence refers to the revenue from King Henry's heavy taxation of the people. The pocket full of rye symbolizes the rich grain fields that were in the custody of the Church and coveted by Henry. The pie was the deeds to the Church properties that Henry confiscated from the Catholic monks. (Henry demanded 24 Church properties from the Abbot of Newstead, and the Abbot handed them over.) The blackbirds refer to the clergy and monks who wailed loudly when they were turned out of their monasteries and the lands confiscated by the King. While Henry was gloating over the increase in the royal treasury, Catholic Queen Catherine was eating bread and the honey of the assurances that Spain and the Pope would not allow Henry to divorce her. The maid – Anne Boleyn was out in the garden hanging out the daintiest frocks from France – the gifts that Henry bestowed upon her. After Henry's divorce from Catherine and marriage to Anne, he soon grew tired of her and snipped off not just her nose but her whole head. Some keys for other poems – Jack was a nickname by which 17th century Englishmen referred to the clergy. Jack and Jill is really about the downfall of the Catholic clergy after Henry broke with Rome. Little Miss Muffet is Mary, the Catholic Queen of Scotland, and she also appears in Mistress Mary Quite Contrary and Little Bo Peep. So refer to English history when repeating these verses to your children or grandchildren.

ST. MATTHEW'S GOSPEL

Chances are you know St. Matthew's Gospel better than you know the other three Gospels. It contains the Sermon on the Mount with the Beatitudes and the Lord's Prayer. It highlights the ministry of Peter. In it, Jesus urges the disciples to works of mercy because "what you do to the least of my brothers, you do to Me." It records the stories of the Birth of Jesus, the coming of the Magi, the flight into Egypt and the slaughter of the innocents. Its account of the death of Christ thunders with an earthquake. For centuries, St. Matthew's popular Gospel dominated the Scripture readings Catholics heard at Mass. Most people assume that the author of this Gospel was the tax collector who decided to follow Jesus. However, it is not likely; most Scripture scholars believe that it was written by an anonymous Jewish Christian who lived at Antioch in Syria. The author borrowed much from St. Mark's Gospel – a pointless method if the writer were indeed an eyewitness to the events in Jesus' life. The Gospel circulated long before the name "Matthew" became attached to it. St. Matthew's Gospel seems intended for an audience of Christians very familiar with the Jewish way of life and the Jewish Scripture, which accounts for the many references to Old Testament passages. Its central message is embedded in the title associated with Jesus at His birth, "Emmanuel," "God is with us." In Jesus, God is indeed with us. To Jesus we respond as disciples. St. Matthew is usually symbolized as a man or an angel recalling the genealogy, which opens the book.

FIRST TIME USHERS:
