

Pilgrimage Tour To THE NEWARK CATHEDRAL To see the Relics of St. Maria Goretti

On Monday, September 21, the Catholic Basilica of the Sacred Heart – Mother Church of the Archdiocese of Newark – will be the first stop on a national tour of the Major Relics of St. Maria Goretti – the Little Saint of Great Mercy. This tour, designed as an introduction to the observance of a world-wide Extraordinary Holy Year of Mercy, will run from September 21 through November 13 and visit locations in 16 states and 25 dioceses across the country. It is the first time that the Relics of St. Maria Goretti, an immensely popular saint, have traveled to the United States, and only the second time that they have been taken on pilgrimage outside of St. Maria's native land of Italy. Presentations on the life and virtues of St. Maria Goretti, the youngest person (she died at the age of 11) ever to be canonized by the Church, are also planned for the day.

On the 21st, the faithful will have ample opportunity to visit and venerate the Relics. Doors of the Cathedral Basilica will open at 9 a.m. and will remain open until 11 p.m. The full schedule for the day will be Veneration 9AM-7PM, Celebration of Mass 7PM, Veneration 8-11PM. **On Monday, Sept 21, we are planning a bus from OLV to attend the Mass at the Cathedral Basilica in Newark. RESPECT LIFE

One of the chief researchers in a landmark study on patients with severe brain injuries noted that these patients are diagnosed falsely "on a disturbingly regular basis." With false diagnoses, fatal mistakes can be made as in the famous case of Terri Schiavo who was fatally deprived of food and water. Says bio-ethicist Wesley J. Smith, "What we did to Terri was a blight on the legal system and bioethics. Pretending otherwise won't make that stain go away." Researchers in Britain and Belgium have found that patients "thought to be in a persistent vegetative state showed brain activity indicating awareness, intent and, in at least one case, a wish to communicate." This is a significant breakthrough in efforts to provide life-sustaining care for comatose patients.

FAMILY PLANNING, GOD'S WAY

A pronounced contraceptive mentality fosters a frivolous abortion mentality. We must furthermore be aware that a lot of contraceptives are actually abortifacients! JUST A REMINDER

The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

MORTAL SIN

The first step in carrying out the Will of God is to avoid mortal sin. Where there is a habit of mortal sin, WHICH ONE DOES NOT INTEND TO GIVE UP, there is no spiritual life. When this condition exists, the soul of such a one is dead. If a man is in that state, he has urgent need of making a good confession and of making the decision to fight manfully against his bad habits. The DECISION to avoid mortal sin is vital to the spiritual life. The fight may not be easy; he may perhaps even fall again and again; but he must be resolutely determined that even if he falls down again, HE WILL NOT STAY DOWN, and he must follow out that determination grimly. The argument that since he continues to fall again and again, what is the good of going to confession, is simply not a valid or sensible argument. The argument that the confession of the same sin over and over again is embarrassing and boring, is not a convincing argument. If a person is the source of one's sin and the cause of one's sin, then one must decide between that person and God. If a place is the source of one's sin and the cause of one's sin, then one must decide between that place and God. If a thing is the source of one's sin, and the cause of one's sin, then one must decide between that thing and God! It is quite impossible to possess both. Mortal sin must be regarded as the greatest possible evil - one to be avoided at all or any cost. On this point there can be no compromise. An offense against God is an offense against God, and no human speculation or analysis can change the fact that GOD MUST NEVER BE OFFENDED. Neither can any human agency or tribunal remove sinfulness from an offense which God has preordained to be sinful and offensive. The law of God is unchangeable, and its application is not open to anyone's private interpretation.
