

From the Desk of Fr. Charlie ...

Compassion Sabbath II



Last week I wrote about the need to be compassionate. To provide for others so as to meet their needs which simply say, "I care." All too often the giving of care is delegated to professionals in the community by appointment or provided by the family members who are also caught up in the varying degrees of drama surrounding those who long for support.

Practical Responses of Care Giving:

- * Offer to sit quietly so care givers can leave the home for a couple hours of rest, attend to their responsibilities, shop, attend appointments and go to church.
- * Prepare a simple meal for caregivers to enjoy at their convenience such as soups, stews, casseroles; anything easily kept and reheat able as needed.
- * Offer to do a couple loads of laundry, especially bedding if someone is bed ridden or bedding needs to be changed frequently. This can easily be done in the home or apartment of those needing care and would be very much appreciated. (This one I know from personal experience. Illness or disability can make the task of changing the bedding an agony to nightmare.)
- * Remember to ask, do not presume their taste in food, beverage and toiletries are the same as yours. Especially for long term, chronic illness or hospice care the issue of food and comfort will be different than your own preferences.

Social Dynamics of Compassionate Care:

Keep visits to the sick and elderly brief while being mindful of their attention span. A quality visit may be short and of few words or at times a telling of a life history by those dying. Conclude your farewell with a simple and familiar prayer or wish for them.

Keep what is observed and revealed confidential as the privacy of all is to be respected at all times. Do not give advice, especially on legal matters. Remember to reassure all involved if you can be called upon and when!

When there is a death, make every effort to be present at part or all of the services.
