Some Notes from Fr. Dwight's Desk.....

Annual Retirement Fund for Religious Collection

Senior Catholic sisters, brothers and religious order priests (Franciscan and Dominican sisters, brothers and priests are examples of this group) spent years working in Catholic schools, hospitals and social-service agencies, often for little or no pay. Their sacrifices now leave their religious communities without adequate savings for retirement and elder care. Your gift to the Retirement Fund for Religious collection helps provide prescription medications, nursing care, and more for more than 35,000 elderly religious and their religious communities who are assisted by this collection each year. Eucharistic Adoration for the Fridays of Advent

Having the opportunity to spend some quiet time with the Lord in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is very much in keeping with the quiet and reflective season of the season of Advent. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will be available each Advent Friday from the conclusion of the 9:00 AM morning Mass until Benediction at 5:00 PM. Adoration will take place in the chapel unless otherwise noted.

Parish Books of Intercessions

At each Mass, we remember a variety of different needs in our world, lifting them up to God in the Prayers of the Faithful. At weekday Masses, we are able to do this in a slightly different way which allows many in the assembly to voice their needs in a spontaneous manner. All of us have prayer intentions we would like to have remembered each day, and so in order to accomplish this we have two new Books of Intercession available in which you may feel free to write particular prayer needs so that they may be remembered at each Mass. One Book of Intercessions is located in the Sacred Heart devotional area in the main church, while the other is located on the standing desk outside the chapel in the stone church. Prayer intentions written in both books will be remembered collectively at each Mass.

Area Communal Penance Services

One of the ways we can prepare ourselves for the coming of Christ at Christmas is through the Advent celebration and reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (confession). The sacrament of Reconciliation is available on Saturday afternoons, 3:30 PM to 4:30 PM. As in years past, we will also partner with two other area parishes for communal penance services:

Tuesday, December 16, 7:00 PM at Holy Redeemer Parish in Burton

Wednesday, December 17, 7:00 PM here at St. John the Evangelist

Thursday, December 18, 7:00 PM at Holy Family Parish in Grand Blanc

Third Sunday of Advent



Today, the Third Sunday of Advent, we celebrate Gaudete Sunday. *Gaudete* is the Latin word meaning “rejoice.” St. Paul is very emphatic in our second reading, telling us to “rejoice always.” This Third Sunday of Advent is set aside as a special time of rejoicing because Christmas is drawing near, and that can only mean one thing: Jesus is near!

Each and every Christian is called to be filled with joy. Not necessarily a feeling of happiness in the way that the world would describe it, but an authentic joy, contentment, and peace of knowing that we are loved by God and that He is near us. So many of the saints throughout history have shown us this joy and peace that surpasses all human understanding. For example, St. Maximillian Kolbe rejoiced by singing and praising God in a Nazi starvation bunker in the midst of a concentration camp. According to the world he had no cause to feel any sort of joy, but he recognized that God was with Him and that was all that mattered. In the end, as St. Augustine says to the Lord, “Our hearts are restless until they rest in You.” Only God can bring us true joy and fulfillment.

Here in Fenton we will probably not find ourselves in such dire circumstances as St. Maximillian Kolbe, but our call to rejoice always is no different than his. In every situation or circumstance in which we find ourselves we are called to rejoice. Not necessarily because we feel good, but because we know we are loved by God and that He is near us. This joy should be something that exudes from us and should be evident to all those we meet.

To stress this point I'll share a brief story. My freshman year of college I was blessed to be able to play for our University's baseball team, while at the same time being in the seminary. I hadn't told anyone on the team that I was studying to be a priest, but always tried to let the joy and love of Jesus shine through me to them. At a certain point, I began to invite some of my teammates to a special Mass we were hosting at the seminary for athletes. When one of them discovered that I was a seminarian, he looked at me with a sudden look of understanding and said, “I knew there was something different about you.” My teammates were able to see the light and joy of Christ shining through me, and many of them did begin to come to our athletes Mass. Jesus wants to shine through you as well, to give you a joy, love, and peace that cannot be contained, that must be shared, and will be noticed by those around you. So as we celebrate this Gaudete Sunday, rejoice in the Lord for He is near, and allow Him to shine in and through you.


Jesus Others and then Yourself

When we go to the supermarket and see aisle after aisle of all kinds of food we may be tempted to forget those who really can't just go and buy whatever they want.


Church pantries have been assisting families in need for many years. The Churches have been able to do this because parishioners are very generous. They do remember the ones in need.


December Weekend Rosary

MORE THAN DISCIPLES

Each of today's four scriptural roles--disciple, prophet, apostle, herald-forms a facet of our life in Christ as we live it day by day. Isaiah tells us that a prophet is anointed, as we were anointed at our baptism in water and the Spirit, to bring glad tidings and to promote God's reign of healing, justice, and peace. An apostle, like Paul, is one who is "sent." Each of us, in his or her own way, is sent by Christ to be a voice of rejoicing, to encourage prophetic voices in the world, and to make sure that the work of the Spirit thrives. John the Baptist shows us the job of the herald, making the Lord's way straight, announcing the coming of the Light of the world. Today we also hear from Mary, model disciple. 
