Some Notes from Fr. Dwight's Desk......

December 8: The Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Christians remember the conception of Christ on the solemnity of the Annunciation (March 25). Because John the Baptist prepared the way for Christ, Eastern Rite Christians celebrate John's conception on September 23. The celebration of the conception of Mary falls nine months before the celebration of her birth, on September 8. Mary's conception day became a feast in the seventh century. The Church teaches that Mary was free from sin from the moment she was conceived. This special grace prepared her to be the mother of God. Mary did not earn this freedom in any way. It was simply a gift bestowed by God. The medieval scholar, Duns Scotus, explained that "no one owes more to Christ than Mary, the immaculate one."

The Feast of the Immaculate Conception, a Holy Day of Obligation, is an opportunity to celebrate God's gracious gift to Mary as part of the plan for our salvation. Masses will be celebrated on Monday, December 8, at 7:00 AM, 8:30 AM and 7:00 PM. All Masses for the Immaculate Conception will be celebrated in the main church. For the sake of clarification: this particular Holy Day is not subject to the Saturday/Monday rule that applies to others. This is because this Holy Day of Obligation is the patronal feast of the United States. As such, it is also a time to pray for the Blessed Virgin's continued care and protection for our nation and its people. It is also important to keep in mind that the 6:00 PM Sunday Mass for Sunday, December 7, will be for the Second Sunday of Advent, not the Immaculate Conception. Sorry—no two-for-one specials.

Senior Catholic sisters, brothers and religious order priests (Franciscan and Dominican sisters, brothers and priests are examples of this group) spent years working in Catholic schools, hospitals and social-service agencies, often for little or no pay. Eucharistic Adoration for the Fridays of Advent

Having the opportunity to spend some quiet time with the Lord in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is very much in keeping with the quiet and reflective season of the season of Advent. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will be available each Advent Friday from the conclusion of the 9:00 AM morning Mass until Benediction at 5:00 PM. Adoration will take place in the chapel unless otherwise noted.

Parish Books of Intercessions

At each Mass, we remember a variety of different needs in our world, lifting them up to God in the Prayers of the Faithful. At weekday Masses, we are able to do this in a slightly different way which allows many in the assembly to voice their needs in a spontaneous manner. All of us have prayer intentions we would like to have remembered each day, and so in order to accomplish this we have two new Books of Intercession available in which you may feel free to write particular prayer needs so that they may be remembered at each Mass. One Book of Intercessions is located in the Sacred Heart devotional area in the main church, while the other is located on the standing desk outside the chapel in the stone church. Prayer intentions written in both books will be remembered collectively at each Mass.

Area Communal Penance Services



In today's Gospel, we here that a prophecy from Isaiah is being fulfilled by John the Baptist. John is the one of whom it is written, "Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way. A voice of one crying out in the desert: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." John the Baptist fulfilled this prophecy 2,000 years

ago by preaching Jesus as the Messiah and pointing towards Him in all of his words and actions. But this was not just a task for John the Baptist, now it's your turn to prepare the way of the Lord in your own heart as well as in the world around you.

It's important for each of us to take time during this Advent season to prepare our own heart to receive Jesus. The big question then is: how do I prepare my heart to receive Jesus? To begin with, spend some time with Him in prayer. Treat your prayer time like an appointment by setting aside some time each day to spend with God, even if it's only 5-10 minutes. Along with that, try not to give God the "leftovers" of your day, but give Him time when you're actually awake and alert. A perfect way to spend some time with God during this Advent season is in Adoration. We are offering Adoration every Friday of Advent here at St. John's to offer people the opportunity to come and spend time with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

But we don't want to just be focused on ourselves during this season of Advent. Just like John the Baptist, we want to prepare the way of the Lord in such a way that those around us might more easily be brought into an encounter with Jesus. John the Baptist, through his words and actions, was able to bring people into an encounter with the Lord, and our words and actions can have the same effect if we're intentional about them. During this Advent season, take some time to talk to family, friends, coworkers, or classmates about the true meaning of Christmas. It may be a small action or a simple word from you that opens up the way of the Lord in that person's heart. Just like John, we should point to Jesus in all that we do and say.



IN THE PEACE OF CHRIST

Marie Standish, age 91, died November 21, 2014. A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated on Saturday, November 29, 2014 with Fr. Dwight Ezop celebrating. Burial followed at St. John Cemetery.

Surviving are: son, Dave (Terry) Standish; 3 grandchildren; 9 great-grandchildren; brother, Frank (Lillian) Kliebert; brothers-in-law, John Standish and Ed Moroz. She was preceded in death by her husband, George; 2 brothers and 1 sister.

Fr. Robert McKeon, age 89, died on Monday, November 24, 2014 at his home in Byron. A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated on Saturday, November 30, 2014 with Bishop Boyea celebrating and several other priests of the diocese concelebrating. Burial followed at St. John Cemetery.

He was a Roman Catholic Priest in the Lansing, Michigan Diocese. He was born September 18, 1925 in Rhinelander, Wisconsin, the third son of Mark Gregory McKeon and Mary Ellen Hogan McKeon. He attended grade school in Waukesha, Wisconsin and Linden, Michigan. He graduated from the Ladysmith Wisconsin High School in June 1944, and entered the United States Navy the same month. He served as a signalman aboard an LST ship in the Western Pacific until the end of World War II, and was discharged in June 1946.

He attended college at the University of Wisconsin in Ladysmith, Wisconsin and the College of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota. He began studies for the priesthood in 1949 and attended seminaries in Grand Rapids and Detroit, Michigan and in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Father Bob was ordained at the Lansing Cathedral on June 6, 1959 and celebrated his first Mass at St. John Parish, Fenton, in the fieldstone church that his grandfather, Frank McKeon, helped build. He served as an assistant pastor at parishes in Jackson, Flint, Lansing and Fenton. He became a pastor at St. Isadore Parish in Laingsburg. He served as pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Parish in Flint, at St. Pius Parish in Flint, and at St. Mary Parish in Mount Morris. He retired in 1997 and moved to his home in Byron. After retiring, he served as sacramental celebrant in St. Joseph's Parish in Gaines until November 2014.

In addition to his parish service, Father Bob was Chaplain for the Daughters of Isabella and for the Divorced and Separated Catholics of Flint and in the Michigan Prison system.

Father Bob was preceded in death by his parents and his two brothers, Leo Gregory and Reverend William James, and by his cousin William Donovan Mandeville who was raised in Father Bob's household and with whom Father Bob was as close as a brother.

Father Bob is survived by three nephews, seven grand-nieces and nephews, and many cousins. Father Bob traveled much of the world from the Western Pacific to Ireland and Italy. He crisscrossed North America by car. He felt at home anywhere in Wisconsin or Michigan, but his family's farm on the Shiawassee River west of Linden was the place on earth dearest to him. Father Bob loved God. He loved God's Church, despite its flaws. He loved his family and multitude of relatives despite our flaws. He loved his parishioners. And he loved his dogs, all of them, one after another, over 89 years, and regarded them as flawless.



Many Hands Make Light Work

The annual St. Vincent de Paul Thanksgiving Basket project culminated in the distribution of 84 baskets or food cards to families in the Fenton area the weekend of November 22-23.

Led by the team of 15 volunteers who operate the food pantry at St. John Church, many volunteers contributed to the success of this year's project.
