**INFANT BAPTISM:** To schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Parents are expected to attend a Pre-Baptismal session. Sessions will be held at Risen Lord Parish on the third Sunday of each month. Registration for the Sacrament of Baptism and the celebration of the Sacrament will still be at the individual parishes on the last Sunday of the month.

**MARRIAGE:** Dates for Marriages are scheduled only through the Priest and only after an initial meeting with the couple. Church law requires a minimum of six months notice before a wedding can be celebrated. In light of the many arrangements for a wedding, the couple should contact the Priest as soon as possible after the engagement is announced.

**INTERESTED IN BECOMING CATHOLIC:** Those wishing to share in the sacramental life of the Church are invited to contact the Parish Office. This specifically applies to those wishing to be baptized, who have not previously shared in the Eucharist, who have not sought to share the sacrament of Confirmation, or those raised in another faith but now choosing to share our Catholic faith.

**HOSPITALIZED OR HOMEBOUND:** If a parishioner is in the hospital or sick at home, please call the Social Ministry Office to arrange for a pastoral visit. Each hospital has a priest, either as a chaplain or assigned from a neighboring parish, for emergencies.

**SPONSOR LETTERS:** Only active and registered members will be issued a Sponsor Letter. The Sponsor should contact the Parish Office at least one week prior to the date needed.

**BULLETIN:** Submissions can be made to bulletinINCandRL@comcast.net. Deadline is 12:00 p.m. on Friday (nine days before the Sunday of the intended publication). Submissions are subject to approval and space limitations.

**What exactly is Eucharistic Adoration?**

Eucharistic adoration is time spent praying with Jesus in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. A consecrated host is displayed in a gold receptacle called a monstrance, which is commonly designed to resemble the sun with rays of light. The word *monstrance* derives from the same word as *demonstrate* and means "to show." In the center is a circular piece called a *luna or lunette* which the consecrated host is visible.

The monstrance was developed during the 14th century when the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ was established and devotion to the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist became popular.

In prayer, we can use the ACTS formula, a format that can easily be used in other prayer situations:

- A-Adoration (give praise)
- C-Contrition (ask for forgiveness for our sins)
- T-Thanksgiving
- S-Supplication (ask God for the things that we & others need)

## Keeping the Faith

Today's Gospel reminds us that how much Jesus can change our lives. Zacchaeus, as a tax collector, would have had a reputation of dishonesty and disloyalty. He was so intent on meeting Jesus, he climbed a sycamore tree in order to be able to see him. Jesus calls Zacchaeus down from the tree so they could spend some time together. Zacchaeus isn't embarrassed by his desire to see Jesus. The people in the village must have wondered why a grown man was up in a tree, waiting to see Jesus. This one meeting with Jesus had Zacchaeus promising to give generously to the poor and restoring anything he had extorted four times over. The Jewish laws regarding restitution were very strict. When Jesus sees that Zacchaeus is repentant, he says, "Today salvation has come to this house." What lengths do we go to in our daily lives to catch a glimpse of Jesus? This week let's work on making things right with anyone we have wronged, so our hearts can be transformed.

### The Month of November is Dedicated to the Holy Souls

Take a specially marked envelope from the church. It contains a blank calendar with spaces to write the name of a person you have lost. Write one name for each day on the calendar. Keep the calendar on your refrigerator. This a wonderful time to pray for that person, but you can also use this time with your family to talk about the good memories you have of that person. You could also put a dime in the envelope for each day. At the end of the month you can use the money to light a candle for all those you have lost. Remember to sign the book in each church for all the people you want remembered with prayers.

### Christ Life

Saturday, November 5th concludes the third part of our Christ Life Sessions. It has been a wonderful experience for all who have attended. We praised God together with prayers and songs. Personally, it helped me to realize although I attend Mass each Sunday, that isn't all there is to being a faithful follower. I don't want to sound like the Pharisee in the Gospel, but I think my prayer life is improving, although there is still a way to go. This program has helped me to rethink what faith means. The way to really share our faith is being the best person we can be. As St Francis said, "Preach the Gospel at all times, and if necessary, use words." Like St. Francis, we should strive to evangelize by our lives and actions. Francis, our Pope, is also a good example of this.

We thank our hosting parishes of St. Cyril, Risen Lord, and Incarnation, all of our facilitators, but especially all who attended. All of our faith experiences were enriched by each other.
