

INFANT BAPTISM: To schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Parents are expected to attend a Pre-Baptismal session. Sessions will be held at Risen Lord Parish on the third Sunday of each month. Registration for the Sacrament of Baptism and the celebration of the Sacrament will still be at the individual parishes on the last Sunday of the month.

MARRIAGE: Dates for Marriages are scheduled only through the Priest and only after an initial meeting with the couple. Church law requires a minimum of six months notice before a wedding can be celebrated. In light of the many arrangements for a wedding, the couple should contact the Priest as soon as possible after the engagement is announced.

INTERESTED IN BECOMING CATHOLIC: Those wishing to share in the sacramental life of the Church are invited to contact the Parish Office. This specifically applies to those wishing to be baptized, who have not previously shared in the Eucharist, who have not sought to share the sacrament of Confirmation, or those raised in another faith but now choosing to share our Catholic faith.

HOSPITALIZED OR HOMEBOUND: If a parishioner is in the hospital or sick at home, please call the Social Ministry Office to arrange for a pastoral visit. Each hospital has a priest, either as a chaplain or assigned from a neighboring parish, for emergencies.

SPONSOR LETTERS: Only active and registered members will be issued a Sponsor Letter. The Sponsor should contact the Parish Office at least one week prior to the date needed.

BULLETIN: Submissions can be made to bulletinINCandRL@comcast.net. Deadline is 12:00 p.m. on Friday (nine days before the Sunday of the intended publication). Submissions are subject to approval and space limitations.

WHY DO WE HAVE EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

As Catholics, we believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. At the Last Supper, Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat; this is my body" (Matthew 26:26). In truth, Jesus is present in the consecrated bread, just as real as Jesus was present at the Last Supper.

This is a mystery to us. As human beings, with our limited understanding, we cannot easily comprehend this. However, we believe that God who created such a beautiful complex world, performed miracles such as parting the Red Sea, changed water into wine, and raised Lazarus from the dead can also change bread into the Body of Jesus and wine into his Blood. The consecrated host and wine tastes like bread and tastes like wine; but we profess, confess, and believe it is Jesus' true Body and Blood. (Transubstantiation: the appearance remain but the substance has changed) We recognize Jesus in the Eucharist through the eyes of faith and with our heart.

PRAYER BEFORE AN ELECTION Lord God, as the election approaches, we seek to better understand the issues and concerns that confront our city, state, and country, and how the Gospel compels us to respond as faithful citizens in our community. We ask for eyes that are free from blindness so that we might see each other as brothers and sisters, one and equal in dignity, especially those who are victims of abuse and violence, deceit and poverty. We ask for ears that will hear the cries of children unborn and those abandoned, men and women oppressed because of race or creed, religion or gender. We ask for minds and hearts that are open to hearing the voice of leaders who will bring us closer to your Kingdom.

Regionalization of Elementary Schools



WHY ARE CATHOLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS IMPORTANT?

- Catholic schools form both the minds and hearts of the young people they serve.
- · Academic formation prepares students to meet the demands of higher education.
- Spiritual formation encourages students to live virtuous lives and strengthens them in a daily relationship with Jesus.
- · Catholic schools also support a family life rooted in faith.
- The goal of Catholic schools is to do everything possible to set their students firmly on the path to heaven.

WHY REGIONALIZE THE CATHOLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS IN THE NORTH HILLS?

- Student populations at a number of Catholic elementary schools in the North Hills region have declined significantly.
- This has strained budgets, leading to tuition increases and the closing of some schools.
- Several North Hills pastors have asked Bishop Zubik for assistance in developing a sustainable model for schools
- The result of regionalization will allow the schools to more effectively fulfill their mission and grow the Church.

WHAT WILL CATHOLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS REGIONALIZATION LOOK LIKE?

• Regionalization involves two complementary components: a new regional administrative structure **AND** new models for existing schools.

1. NEW REGIONAL ADMINISTRATIVE STRUCTURE

- No school will be the ministry of just one parish or a few parishes. Instead, each school will be a ministry of and supported by every parish in that region.
- While each school will have a principal, a regional administrator will oversee operations



- · Benefits include:
 - Comprehensive and uniform instructional programs
 - Strengthened Catholic identity and mission
 - Stabilized enrollment and tuition costs
 - Collaboration in fundraising, technology, athletics, etc.
 - More effective use of resources, including facilities

2. NEW MODELS FOR EXISTING SCHOOLS

- Through regionalization, no school will belong to just one parish.
- While some schools will see little change, others will undergo various kinds of reconfiguration to address declining enrollment and increased tuition
- Task forces consisting of the pastors of parishes with existing schools and other members of those communities will design the models for the following school groupings:

TASK FORCE GROUP 1 Saint Alexis School

Saint Alexis School Saint Alphonsus School

TASK FORCE GROUP 3 Assumption School Northside Catholic School

TASK FORCE GROUP 2

Saint Bonaventure School Saint Mary of the Assumption School Saint Ursula School

TASK FORCE GROUP 4

Saint Sebastian School
Saint Teresa of Avila School

*While part of the regionalization process, Christ the Divine Teacher Academy and Saint James School are not part of a Task Force Group.

PLANNING TO DATE

- 1. The diocese and parishes are forming a non-profit corporation, North Hills Regional Catholic Elementary Schools, Inc., for the purpose of operating and administering Catholic school programs from preschool through eighth grade.
- 2. The diocesan Schools Office, principals and union officials have met with teachers to review plans and receive their feedback
- 3. Pastors of parishes with schools in the North Hills have held meetings with their parish pastoral councils and finance councils.


- 1. Task forces will be formed for the four school groups in the region to create proposed models. The pastors of the parishes in each group will appoint the task force members. These task forces will meet beginning the week of **October 31, 2016**.
- 2. The models will be presented to parents of parish school students through an online feedback survey beginning **November 17, 2016**.
- 3. Task forces will again meet to review the survey results and parent feedback and present present proposals to pastors by **December 2, 2016**.
- 4. Parent meetings will be held the week of **December 5, 2016** for each task force group to share the final proposals.
- 5. Final proposals will then be sent to the Schools office and be presented to Bishop Zubik before the end of the year.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) approved a special triennial collection for the AMS in November 2012. The first National Collection for the AMS was timed to coincide with Veterans Day November 2013 and raised more than \$8,239,000. The second National Collection for the AMS will be taken in dioceses and parishes across the country in 2016, for most at Masses the weekend of 5-6 November, or as otherwise determined by an individual diocese or parish.

The Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS) was established by Saint John Paul II in 1985 to provide the Catholic Church's full range of pastoral ministries to those in the United States Armed Forces. The mission of the Archdiocese is to "serve those who serve" by providing the same pastoral care and services as any other Catholic diocese to Catholics serving in the United States Armed Forces, enrolled in U.S. Military Academies, undergoing treatment at any of the 153 Department of Veterans Affairs' Medical Centers in the U.S., Puerto Rico and Guam, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders, and the families of these populations. Programs and services vital to the unique mission and ministry of the Archdiocese include *Vocations, Evangelization and Catechesis, Sacramental Records, Tribunal,* and *Veterans Affairs*:

The AMS Office of Vocations informs and supports men exploring a priestly vocation and provides opportunities for vocation awareness and discernment with a focus on the military chaplaincy. The AMS Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program is a partnership with local dioceses and religious communities around the country. Currently, the AMS partners with 23 dioceses across the U.S. with 28 co-sponsored seminarians studying in 16 seminaries. As many as 20 additional candidates are in-processing for 2016 and, since the fall 2014, 113 candidates have been on one or more of the AMS discernment retreats and expressed interest in the Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program and military chaplaincy. Once a seminarian is in the Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program, the AMS covers half of the costs to his home diocese for priestly formation.

In 2016, three priestly ordinations and one transitional diaconate ordination are expected. Twelve priests are currently serving as priests in their home dioceses before they will begin ministry as active duty military chaplains. In 2015, three new co-sponsored priests joined a branch of the military. The Nation and the Church continue to depend on this generation of future priests to relieve a chronic shortage of Catholic chaplains in the military. At the same time AMS vocations programs have surfaced numerous other vocations to the priesthood and religious life who do not intend to serve as chaplains!

The AMS receives no funding from the military or the government in support of the aforementioned programs and relies solely on private donors. The AMS annual operating budget is over \$6.8 million, which includes the cost of maintaining an archive of more than 3 million sacramental records, a tribunal to adjudicate marriage annulments and other issues of canon law, and a religious education and faith-formation program. Additionally, the AMS average annual share of expenses for the Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program is more than \$2.8 million over the next five years. The AMS average annual cost per seminarian is \$18,000.

While the Government is reducing the size of the Armed Forces, the world situation, as we have repeatedly and dramatically witnessed both at home and abroad, continues to make the need for a strong military more evident. It is imperative that the Catholic faithful who defend our religious freedom do not have to sacrifice theirs.
