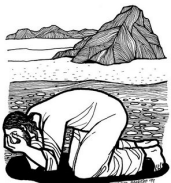

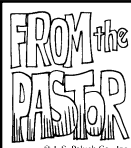

RECONCILIATION: Saturday afternoon 3:00 - 3:30 PM before the 4:00 PM Mass, or by appointment.
INFANT BAPTISM: To schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Parents are expected to attend a Pre-Baptismal session which are held at Risen Lord Parish on the third Sunday of the month. The celebration and registration for the Sacrament of Baptism will still be at the individual parishes. Baptisms will take place on the last Sunday of the month.
MARRIAGE: Dates for Marriages are scheduled only through the priest and only after an initial meeting with the couple. Church law requires a minimum of six months notice before a wedding can be celebrated. In light of the many arrangements for a wedding, the couple should contact the priest as soon as possible after the engagement is announced.
INTERESTED IN BECOMING CATHOLIC: Those wishing to share in the sacramental life of the Catholic Church are invited to contact the Parish Office. This specifically applies to those wishing to be baptized, who have not previously shared in the Eucharist, who have not sought to share the sacrament of Confirmation, or those raised in another faith but now choosing to share our Catholic faith.
HOSPITALIZED OR HOMEBOUND: If a parishioner is in the hospital or sick at home, please call the Social Ministry Office at Incarnation or the Main Office at Risen Lord to arrange for a pastoral visit. Each hospital has a chaplain for emergencies.
PRAYERS FOR THE SICK: Please call the Main Office or Social Ministry Office to request your loved one to be on the Prayer List. Due to HIPPA Regulations, only an immediate family member can make this request.
SPONSOR LETTERS: Only active and registered members will be issued a Sponsor Letter. The Sponsor should contact the Parish Office at least one week prior to the date needed.
BULLETIN: Submissions can be made to bulletinINCandRL@comcast.net. Deadline is 12:00 PM on Friday (nine days before the Sunday of the intended publication). Submissions are subject to approval and space limitations.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION In recent years, there has been a resurgence of interest in various forms of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Some people suggest that this recovers an ancient tradition in the church, when in fact the practice belongs to a later time. The custom of showing the consecrated host to the people, encased in a vessel called a monstrance, developed in a period of history when even very pious people received Communion only rarely. The opportunity to see the host raised high above the head of the priest at Mass, or to see the host exposed outside of Mass, was thought by many to be a form of spiritual Communion. Without question, our Catholic practice of reserving the consecrated host both for adoration and Communion of the sick and dying is a cherished tradition.

Over the next few weeks, we'll look at how these traditions developed and how the Church envisions reservation and adoration today. We do this by the light of the liturgical reforms that have restored a heightened appreciation for how receiving the Body and Blood of Christ is central to our worship. *Perpetual Adoration, Reservation, Benediction, and Reposition* are all part of the Catholic vocabulary. Often the terms are misused, and a tangled history - as well as widely varying practices in our parishes - adds to the confusion. Many Catholics today have never participated in Benediction, or even spent time in adoration on Holy Thursday night. There's plenty of interesting history, much of it surprising and challenging, and we will do our best to inform you along the way.

INCARNATION OF THE LORD PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

Christ became human, and we take up His ministry of love, service, and compassion as an expression of our faith in the Word Incarnate.

CONNECTIONS The second reading this Sunday is not easy to follow, especially when some of Paul's sentences are more like paragraphs. But you will notice that he makes several important connections: between sin and death, between Adam and Jesus, and between obedience and disobedience.

Sin, he says, is the cause of death. Of course, everyone is subject to death at some point, even if they haven't sinned. A less serious sin can be a little "death" when it makes us feel that we are not as close to God as we could be. And sins that we might think are not a big deal, like smoking, can lead to serious health problems.

The connection between Adam and Jesus is not so obvious. Adam was the first to bring sin and death into the world. Jesus is the first to bring forgiveness by his death on the cross. The main difference between them is that Adam disobeyed God, while Jesus was obedient to his Father. Adam reminds me of a child who knows what he is supposed to do, but thinks that he can do the opposite and get away with it.

In the Gospel, Satan can be thought of as trying to get Jesus to do things the easy way. When he tempts Jesus to turn stones into bread, he shows Jesus an easy way to feed the people. But Jesus takes a better way, when he feeds us with himself in the Eucharist. The devil says Jesus can throw himself off the temple as a dramatic way to attract followers; Jesus lets himself hang from the cross to draw people to himself. Satan promises the kingdoms of the world if Jesus will only worship him. But Jesus chose to be crowned with thorns and receive his kingdom when he rose from the dead.

Our Risen Lord calls us to rejoice as a united people in the Good News that God loves us and has saved us. Each of us, by virtue of our baptism, is challenged to carry God's love to all in our neighborhoods. STRENGTH AGAINST TEMPTATION The first Sunday of the season of Lent always includes a Gospel account of the temptation of the Lord Jesus in the desert by the devil. This year, the story is set against the backdrop of the first reading from Genesis, which recounts the very first temptation by the devil. That story is set in a garden of delight. The Gospel story is set in the desert. As believers, we know that temptation comes our way in our own gardens of delight as well as the deserts of our lives. As Lent begins, our attention is drawn to that temptation within each of us to become like God - we want control, power, and answers to all of life's difficult questions. As communities of faith, we are given this season of repentance so that we can join our hearts with others on the difficult journey of conversion. We look to God and to one another for strength against temptation.





Keeping the Faith

Today's Gospel reminds of the forty day fast of Jesus. He went out into the desert and ate nothing for forty days. Satan comes and attempts to make Jesus prove He is the Son of God. He knows how hungry Jesus is and wants Him to turn stones into bread to eat. Jesus reminds us that we live by God's word and not by physical bread. We know by God's word how much He loves us and He will always be here for us. After the devil takes Jesus to a temple pinnacle, Satan asks Jesus to throw Himself down because the angels will protect Him. Jesus warns Satan not to put the Lord, your God To the test. The third temptation takes place on a high mountain. Satan tells Jesus to kneel down and adore him and all of the kingdoms of the world will be given to Jesus. Satan knows that Jesus is God, so why does he even bother to tempt Him? How are we preparing to resist temptation? Three points are emphasized. We can rely on the word of God. Jesus passed all tests by dying for us on the cross. A place has been prepared for all of us in the Kingdom of Heaven. Lent is a time for fasting and abstinence during this forty day period. Fasting has been reduced to two days, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. We are required to abstain from meat on the Fridays during Lent. Lent used to be a time when abstaining of sweets, smoking, ice cream, etc. was emphasized. Giving up things is not a bad thing to do, but what are we going to add that will improve and strengthen us spiritually? We could add a few minutes of silent reflection on the Lenten readings of the day, follow the Best Lent Ever program, or do something nice for someone we don't like once a week. What's your plan?

Are you looking for a volunteer opportunity? Three Rivers Hospice is looking for volunteers to provide companionship, read or write letters for patients. You may also crochet lap robes, work on craft projects, style hair, or provide any other skill you may have. They ask for an hour a week in your own area. Information is available at each church.

I am looking for 3-5 group leaders or more from Incarnation and Risen Lord for small group discussions after the 9:00 AM Mass and the 11:00 AM beginning in April. It would be a once a month event, alternating leaders. Possible discussions would be the Sunday reading, *The Joy of the Gospel* by Pope Francis, *Resisting Happiness* by Matthew Kelly, or something of the group's choice. To discuss the possibilities there will be a meeting on **March 16th at 7:00 PM at Incarnation in the Library.**
