

In the Middle Ages, in Europe, swarms of insects were destroying the crops. The farmers began to pray to the Blessed Mother for help. Shortly thereafter ladybugs came and ate all of the insects. The farmers called these insects, the "Beetles of Our Lady". Over time, they became known as "Lady Beetles", and in America, Lady Bugs. 
Vacation Bible School

Breaking Open the Word: John 17:20-26

Listen to the Word: As you hear this reading, what words or phrases strike you? What in this reading touches your heart? What lingers in your memory?

Look into Your Life:

Children: Jesus tells us He is always with us. Name a time this past week when you knew that God was with you in a special way.

Youth: Jesus prayed for his disciples, that others might believe in him through their words. How are you spreading your belief in Jesus through your words and actions? Do others know who Jesus is by knowing you?

Adults: Jesus invites us to be one with God. Name a moment when you were one with God this past week.

Let us pray for the grace of unity with each other, as children of God.

On Pentecost Weekend, Saturday, May 14 and Sunday May 15, 2016 please remember to wear red the liturgical for this event! Also, let's stay and celebrate our parish anniversary with cake and light refreshments. **Come, Holy Spirit!**

CONTINUALLY PRAISING GOD

In both the first reading and the Gospel we are told about Christ's glorious ascension into heaven. Paul's letter to the Ephesians reminds us that Christ has been seated at God's right hand in heaven, above every choir of angels. There might be a temptation to stay at an awed distance from Jesus Christ. However, the tone of today's readings is far from that temptation. The tone is exultant and the message is urgent. We are to be his witnesses, and the Gospel describes the first witnesses this way: "[W]ith great joy . . . they were continually in the temple praising God" (Luke 24:53).

How can we continually praise God? The answer can be found in the second reading, in which Paul prays that God will give us a "Spirit of wisdom and revelation" in order to know Christ clearly (Ephesians 1:17). We cannot stand at a distance. We are to be enlightened and empowered.



REVISITING OUR BAPTISM

A mere seven weeks ago thousands of new Church members were baptized. Their new life in Christ has once again infused new life into the Church. Their new-found faith has inspired and bolstered the faith of those who have followed Christ for many years. As the Easter season nears its end, we revisit the scene of our baptisms. In the second reading we hear Christ calling us: "Come. . . . Let . . . the one who wants it receive the gift of life-giving water" (Revelation 22:17).

But our baptism is not one of water only. John refers to washed robes, and we know that this washing is to be "in the blood of the Lamb." To make sure we get this message, we have today's first reading from Acts. It is the story of Stephen, the first Christian to be killed for his faith in Jesus. We remember the promise and also the cost of being a disciple of Christ.
