

Keeping the Faith

Today is Pentecost Sunday, the birthday of the Church.

In this Gospel, the Holy Spirit is described in two ways. In Acts the Spirit falls upon those present with "a noise like a driving wind." A driving wind would be a very strong wind that moves things all over the place.

We cannot see wind, but we see the effects that wind has on objects. It can also be felt. We can imagine this driving force in our own lives. What needs to be moved about? Do we need to drive out anger and resentment?

John's Gospel describes the breath of Jesus falling on the disciples like an essential form of life. It is quieter. We sometimes need to move in a more subtle way. The Holy Spirit gives us the courage we need to strengthen or change the way we live. The Holy Spirit cannot really be defined, except as the third person of the Trinity.

How is the Holy Spirit moving in our lives?

Jesus, please breathe the Holy Spirit into me so we may give witness to others as the disciples did on that first Pentecost.

Vacation Bible School



Breaking Open the Word: John 20:19-23

Suggested text for faith sharing: Today's Gospel

Step One: Listen to the Word

As you hear this reading, what words or phrases strike you? What in this reading touches your heart? What lingers in your memory?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: Jesus tells us that we need to forgive to have peace. Name one way that you can forgive a friend or classmate.

Question for Youth: St. Paul tells us that we all have unique gifts for the good of others. What is special about you? How can you use those gifts to help others – friends, family, strangers?

Question for Adults: Even as working disciples of Christ, we are given the gift of peace. How do you experience this gift, and how do you share it with others?

Let us pray for openness in our hearts, that we might be ready to forgive freely, and hence to live in peace.






