


Finding God on Vacation

What should you do? We do not need to use an alternative (i.e. bottled water) water supply. However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor.






Enrollments Open at Saint Sebastian

Saint Sebastian School at McKnight and Siebert Roads in Ross Township is now enrolling for Preschool through Eighth Grades for 2016-17. The school offers half-day Preschool classes for 3-year-olds on Tuesdays and Thursdays, 8:30-11 a.m.

The full day Pre-Kindergarten program for 4-year-olds is from 8:30 am to 2:50 pm Mondays through Fridays. This is in addition to half-day classes for 4-year-olds on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 8:30-11:30 a.m. Preschool and Pre-Kindergarten class sizes are limited to 15 students to maintain an 8-1 student-teacher ratio.

Full day Kindergarten is also offered. Before and after school care is from 7 to 8:15 a.m. with breakfast available and from 3 to 6 pm with time provided for homework.
