

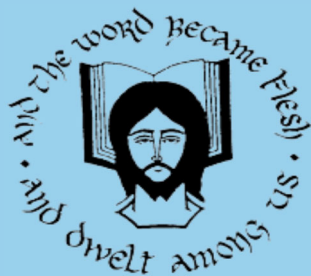

Today is the feast of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

This story of the loaves and fishes is one of the few that is told in all four Gospels. The disciples want to send the crowd away. They cannot imagine having enough food to feed 5,000 people. Jesus just tells them to gather what food anyone has.

We don't know how, but all of a sudden everyone is fed. There is no explanation in the Gospel of how this was done. Jesus just makes it happen.

What a beautiful explanation of the Eucharist! We will always be fed and never sent away empty. Jesus gives Himself to us, and we are nourished. It is an unending satisfaction, instead of hunger.

Are we satisfied after receiving Eucharist? The presence of Jesus is always with us. All Catholics believe this is really the Body and Blood of Jesus. The commingling of the Bread and Wine is done at the consecration. Because of this, we receive Jesus whether we receive the Body or the Blood.

Year of Mercy Continues

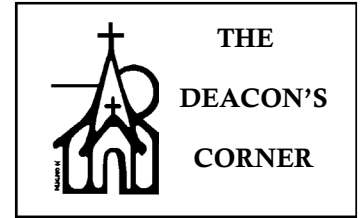

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

~ Jesus continues to offer himself to us and feed us in the Holy Eucharist.

Breaking Open the Word: Luke 9:11b-17

Listen to the Word: As you hear this reading, what words or phrases strike you? What in this reading touches your heart? What lingers in your memory?

Look into Your Life:

Children: How can you share what you have received from Jesus with others this week?

Youth: Each week, when we celebrate the Holy Eucharist we are asked to "do this in remembrance of me". How else do you acknowledge the importance of Jesus in your life? Through prayer? Through the ways that you treat others?

Adults: How can you prepare yourself to be nourished by Jesus in the Eucharist this week?



Let us pray in thanksgiving for the strength and nourishment we all receive through the Eucharist.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

1333 At the heart of the Eucharistic celebration are the bread and wine that, by the words of Christ and the invocation of the Holy Spirit, become Christ's Body and Blood. Faithful to the Lord's command the Church continues to do, in his memory and until his glorious return, what he did on the eve of his Passion: "He took bread. . ." "He took the cup filled with wine. . ."

The signs of bread and wine become, in a way surpassing understanding, the Body and Blood of Christ; they continue also to signify the goodness of creation. Thus in the Offertory we give thanks to the Creator for bread and wine,¹⁵⁴ fruit of the "work of human hands," but above all as "fruit of the earth" and "of the vine" - gifts of the Creator. The Church sees in the gesture of the king-priest Melchizedek, who "brought out bread and wine," a prefiguring of her own offering.¹⁵⁵

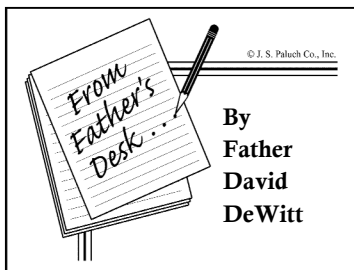
