

THANKSGIVING

The word "thanksgiving" most often calls to our mind the holiday in November. But as early as the middle of the second century Justin Martyr referred to the blessed bread and wine of the Lord's Supper as "food we call 'thanksgiving'" (in Greek *eucharistia*). The Thanksgiving we celebrate in the autumn is at times marked by a sort of proud societal self-congratulation and the consumption of food until we sink into an inert stupor. The "thanksgiving" that we call our Eucharist is just the opposite: we are led to it by an acknowledgment of our own failings; we remember our humble place in the scheme of things by giving praise to God alone.

While the food of Christ's body and blood fills our spiritual hungers, it also creates in us a greater hunger. We are not sent to our spiritual sofas to let the Lord's Supper settle; we are sent to be living signs of that thanksgiving for the world by looking out for the poor and powerless, feeding the hungry, caring for the sick, speaking out against the self-righteous. In short, the hunger created by our doing in remembrance of Christ must lead us to living in remembrance of him.

Keeping the Faith

Today is the feast of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. According to the theologian Denise Anderson, the feast finds its beginnings in a vision by Juliana of Liege, a religious mystic who lived in Belgium. Juliana had a vision where she saw a full moon with a dark spot. She thought the moon represented the life of the Church and the dark spot signified the absence of solemnity that focused on the body and blood of Christ. Juliana petitioned the Bishop of Liege to institute such a feast. He did so in his own diocese and then throughout the whole Church in 1246, with a dual emphasis on the Eucharist and the Church itself, alongside any Eucharistic processions. This feast offers us time to reflect on Our Lord in the Eucharist and our holy connections with each other. When we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus, we do so as a community who knows we are connected with everyone beyond our walls. We are Christ's Body and Blood to others and do whatever we can to make earth more like heaven. What can you do to share the body and blood of Christ beyond Church walls? 



Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

— Jesus is our food for the journey.

Breaking Open the Word:

Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

Listen to the Word: As you hear the story of the Lord's Supper proclaimed today, what words or phrases strike you? What in this reading touches your heart?

Look into Your Life:

Children: Why do you like receiving Holy Communion?
Youth: What does it mean for you that the bread and wine becomes Jesus' Body and Blood during the liturgy of the Eucharist? What feelings or ideas does it surface?

Adults: When you receive Holy Communion and hear the words "Body of Christ...Blood of Christ" what are some of the thoughts and feelings that you have?

Family Activities: To celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord, share with your child remembrances of his or her First Communion day. If your child has not yet received the Sacrament, talk about what that day will mean for her or him.

- ◆ Hum a few bars of your favorite hymn about Jesus' Body and Blood and have the members of your family try to guess the song. Sing together a Eucharist song the family knows.
- ◆ As a family, prepare a meal in which each person helps in the preparation. Talk about what each person contributed. Before eating the meal, say a prayer to thank God for all God's gifts and to ask God's blessing on all.


