





THE LORD OF LIFE



At this bountiful time of year, our Sunday readings teem with life and abundance. Both the first reading, from the book of Wisdom, and the Gospel passage from Mark assure us that God did not make death or even will us to be ill. Illness and death entered the world through the presence of evil, the Wisdom author tells us. Mark's stories of Jesus healing a hemorrhaging woman and resuscitating a dead little girl make it clear that Jesus is from God. As the Son of God he does not will that anyone suffer illness or death. In the face of such power, the second reading, from Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians, provides a stark contrast. Jesus, who could raise the dead to new life, "though he was rich, for your sake he became poor" (2 Corinthians 8:9). Our gift of new life from Christ demands our response in charity.

In today's Gospel, we see a woman of great faith. She had been suffering for twenty years and had visited many doctors. The woman hears about Jesus and plans on somehow meeting Him and being cured. Jesus is going to the house of Jarius to cure his daughter, who had fallen ill. While on His way there, the woman touches His cloak and feels that she is cured.

Jesus asks the apostles, who had touched His cloak. There is such a large crowd that the apostles say they don't know. After feeling the healing power of Jesus, the woman seeks Him out. Jesus says to her, "Woman your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction."

When Jesus arrives at the house of Jarius, his daughter is dead. Jesus says to Jarius, "Do not be afraid; just have faith."



Many people remember Bishop Fulton Sheen. Archbishop Sheen began public life as a theologian. According to David Mill's column in *The Pittsburgh Catholic*, while Archbishop Sheen was teaching at The Catholic University of America, he hosted a popular show called "The Catholic Hour" and started hosting a television show called "Life is Worth Living" and then another called "The Fulton Sheen Program". David Mills recommends one of the archbishop's books called "The Quotable Fulton Sheen". The book is still in print. Some excerpts from the book: On prayer: There are not two kinds of answers to prayer, but three. One is "Yes", one is "No". The third is "Wait". On faith: "Faith no more destroys reason than a telescope destroys the vision." Against people who complain that the church has too many doctrines: "That science or church which has the greatest amount of dogma is the science of the church that has been doing the most thinking." For two thousand years the Church has been doing a tremendous amount of solid, hard thinking and has hence has built up dogmas as a man might build a house of brick, but grounded on a rock. It might be worth purchasing or checking it out of the library.




A Grant from the Food Bank
