

## Keeping the Faith

In today's Gospel, Jesus is telling us to look to spiritual things rather than physically feeding ourselves. The people are asking Jesus when he arrived. The crowd was satisfied because they had eaten the loaves and fishes. They were asking Jesus to give them more signs so they could believe in Him. Why can't He perform another miracle? Their ancestors followed Moses and ate manna in the desert. They grumbled about their plight. Jesus explains that it wasn't Moses who gave them the manna, but God, the Father. The bread of heaven is what comes down and gives life to the world. They ask for this bread. Jesus says, "I am the bread of life. He who comes to Me shall not hunger and who believes in Me shall not thirst." Just as the Israelites grumbled in the desert, so does the crowd grumble. They want another miracle. When we pray sometimes, we are not happy when our prayers are not answered right away. Let's concentrate on Jesus being the bread of life for all of us.



## Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

~ Jesus is the Bread of Life

**Breaking Open the Word: John 6:24-35**

**Listen to the Word:** As you hear this familiar story read to you again today, what words or phrases strike you? What image from this story lingers in your mind's eye?

**Look into Your Life:**

**Children:** Why is Jesus compared to bread? How can his teachings be like food?


**Youth:** Jesus is the bread that gives us life. How does believing in Jesus make your life different?

**Adults:** How do you partake of the nourishment that Jesus provides? How often?

**Family Activity:** Make unleavened bread, the type Jesus shared with his disciples.

Mix the dry ingredients. (Don't sift the flour.) Cut in the shortening. Mix the water in gradually until the mixture rolls itself into a ball. Divide the dough into thirds, and knead each part ten times. Roll the dough portions out to 3/8" thickness. Place the loaf on a greased cookie sheet. Bake for ten minutes at 375°. Ingredients:

1 1/2 cups white flour, 1/2 cup wheat flour, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 1/2 teaspoons sugar, 3/4 teaspoon baking soda, 2 teaspoons shortening, 1/2 to 3/4 cup water.

#### **Mission Donation**


