



Breaking Open the Word: John 6:41-51





After consultation with Father Lelonis:
**Scheduling a baptism at Incarnation of the Lord
and Risen Lord Parishes**

BEGINNING in September, 2015, the sacrament of Baptism will be celebrated on the 4th Sunday of each month ONLY. Before the date of baptism is scheduled, all required paperwork must be in the parish office. What do we mean by "required paperwork"? This is what is required: All the necessary information about the person to be baptized must be in the parish office....name, birth-date, place of birth, parents' names, all God-parent information and required eligibility certificates for the God-parent(s), copies of birth certificate, permission of proper pastor when person to be baptized is from another parish, proper information for an individual who will stand as a proxy for the God-parent(s) and any other information which could be needed.... before the celebration takes place.

A word about God-parents...a person standing as a God-parent, according to canon law (church law), must fulfill particular requirements before they can serve in this important role. A God-parent is a baptized Catholic who has completed the initiation process in the Catholic Church. This means that the prospective God-parent must have received their First Holy Communion and the sacrament of Confirmation. They also must be practicing their faith on a regular basis, be at least 16 years of age, and if married, their marriage must be a sacramental one, that is, one which was celebrated in the Catholic Church or with the permission of the Catholic Church, celebrated before a protestant minister. A man and woman married in a civil ceremony or anyone living together as husband and wife without the benefit of living in a sacramental marriage are not eligible to be a God-parent for the sacrament of baptism or as a sponsor for the sacrament of Confirmation. Parents may choose either one sponsor - a man or woman in good standing or they may choose two sponsors – in that case a man and a woman. The Holy See does not permit two men or two women sponsors.

What about one person being a "Christian witness" (only one Christian witness to accompany a qualified sponsor)? The idea of having a Christian witness does not have a basis in canon or church law. It has become a practice in which a BAPTIZED NON-CATHOLIC is asked to stand as a witness to the fact that a Catholic baptism is taking place. This is reserved solely for baptized non-Catholics...and not for baptized Catholics who lack particular sacraments of initiation needed to be a God-parent. Please be very certain when doing your "homework" in choosing people to be God-parents!
