THE APOSTLES: MATTHEW

We are not exactly sure what happened to Matthew after the Holy Spirit came upon the apostles at Pentecost.

Early writers tell us that he preached among the Jews for fifteen years before going

into other countries. Before leaving, he wrote one of the four gospels.

We are not sure which countries were visited by Saint Matthew. It seems, though, that he was put to death as a martyr for the faith.

Saint Matthew is often represented in art as a winged man carrying a lance.
