Who do you say that I am?

Prayer is at the root of knowing Christ

Imagine the delight of Simeon (a devout man whom the Spirit was upon) and Anna (an elderly prophetess who "worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer") to be at the temple when Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to be presented to the Lord. Their lives of prayer and holiness granted them the opportunity to gaze upon the face of the child Jesus and know with certainty that He was the long-awaited savior. May we, too, be rooted in prayer so that we are able to let the "peace of Christ control our hearts" and to show "heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience" until He comes again.

We hope you will consider joining us at one of our next WDYSTIA presentations on *Jesus: Person of Prayer.* In the Gospel this weekend we hear that "The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him." What must have those early years for the Holy Family been like? Jesus would have been an obedient son, studied Scripture and learned to pray. We begin to see the fruits of those hidden years when Jesus comes to the Jordan to be baptized, followed by forty days of fasting and prayer in the desert.



It is mid-morning in November, and Jim Thompson greets his pastor, Fr. Huy Nguyen, at his front door. "I cannot see," Jim reflects, "but when Fr. Huy goes out of his way to bring me communion or to just visit, it makes my day. He gives me the strength to keep going."
